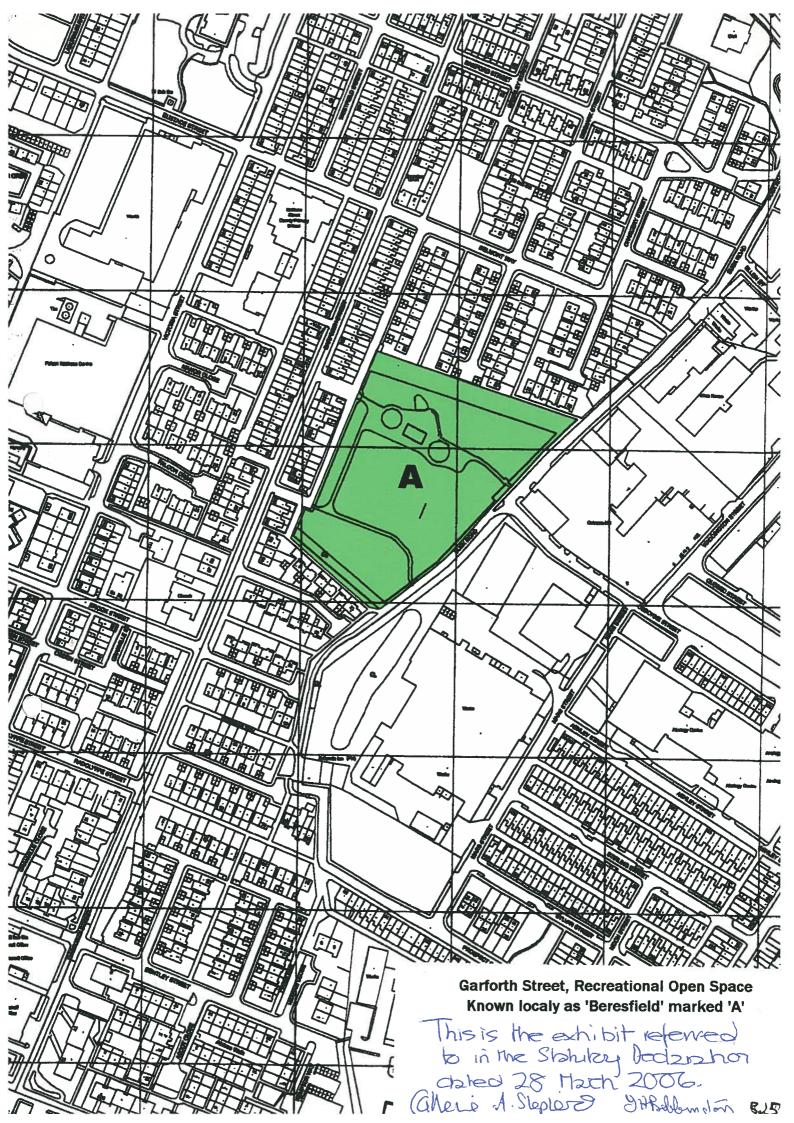

Dear Mr Evans,

Apologies for my late response domestic issues have taken precedence over last few months.

In reply to Mr Mycocks letter of objection I would reply as follows
I have been in residence at the above address since 1973 since that time usage of the field as been enjoyed by local residents without restriction. The use of the date of 1993 was arbitrary and was used as I believe is allowable under current legislation.

- a) I would suggest that sufficient evidence to demonstrate that the usage as of right for lawful sports and pastimes by local residents was supported by the objections of local residents to the Planning Application ref. PA/046981/04 the erection of a children's centre at this site. The Planning Committee rejected this application. At this time letters of objection to the application were in excess of 200 and petitions containing over 400 signatures were submitted. I would suggest that the people who wrote the letters of objection regarded it, as their right to use Berry's Field for lawful sports and pastimes and that the usage for such activities has existed for is excess of the required 20 years. I believe that it is up to OMBC to disprove this self-apparent fact. A repeat of this excercise I do not believe to be neccessary.
- b) Berry's Field has over the years has been subject to boundary changes to facilitate local needs the comment about land purchased in 1965 by Chadderton UDC ignores the fact that at that time Berry's Field extended up Bamford Street and that the only housing at the rear of Garforth was that on Brierly Street and Denmark Street. The current boundaries of Berry' Field were establish following a land swop between Parks and Housing Department's. The northern half of the Busk Estate was built by Housing on what was then Berry's Field and in turn gave up was the old Busk Mill site that land south of the footpath to Parks. It would suggest to me that the land purchased in 1965 under the Physical Training and Recreation Act 1937 was in part built on at the building of the northern part of the Busk Estate. This is confirmed by the plan provided in the letter of objection to this application. I would comment that most of the remaining land under this purchase was the subject of the above Planning Application (So much for the 1937 Act)
- c) Regarding the erection of the play equipment in 1993 local residents opposed this, however at that time

people were somewhat naive about the workings of local government not having easy access to information as they now have via the internet. OMBC ignored the verbal protest of residents and proceeded with the installation of the play equipment. The funding for this I understand to be Euro Money on a use or lose it basis.

- d) The fact that OMBC placed the site under the control of Leisure Services Committee has no bearing the internal organisation of OMBC is not relevant to the application. With regard to the comment regarding insurance I would expect that all of the land owned by OMBC would carry Public Liability cover anyway. The maintenance of the site by OMBC is variable, apart from grass cutting other maintenance is somewhat lacking a field visit to the site would raise questions about Health and Safety of user's rubbish and broken glass is everywhere.
- e) The fencing of the land was again initiated against the wishes of local residents again Euro Money. Since it's erection there has been no maintained of the fence in fact efforts to persuade Parks to renew the rotting outer fencing in front of Denmark Way have been ignored. With regard to signs on the site the only signs erected 'NO GOLF' were placed on the site as a knee-jerk reaction when a resident of Garforth Street was injured by a golf ball in their backyard.

In the last 30 years OMBC has never attempted to impede or prevent the total freedom of the local residents in their use of the site either by implied intention or the erection of permissive signs.

The erection of playground equipment (now removed) or fencing the area should not in my opinion affect this application. The schedules of work attached to the objection are in my opinion 'snow' and do not offer any evidence to support the objection. In fact the information contained in the objection documents will be very useful with any future dealings with OMBC regarding this site.
