10 FAILSWORTH AND HOLINWOOD POLICE REPORT

The Chair welcomed Inspector Michael Kennedy-Smith and Sergeant Paul Archer, from Greater Manchester Police, who attended this evening's meeting to present the new Oldham Local Policing Model.


It was explained that the new policing model had been introduced on 9th May 2016 to move to a "place based" approach with strong, integrated Neighbourhood Policing. This would allow more Police presence on the streets to engage communities and partners in identifying problems and providing an integrated response. However, Police intervention would always take place when people were vulnerable, in danger or distressed.

Elected Members sought and received clarification of the following matters:

- Anti-social behaviours in Failsworth Memorial Park, bowling green; also young people riding their bikes on pavements in Failsworth West The enforcement measures were listed. However, the focus of the Police was on the preventative work carried out by the Neighbourhood Beat Officers, such as school talks, advising parents and engaging with young people in the community. These actions were part of a new programme on anti-social behaviours that had replaced Operation Tuscan.
- Reduced numbers of Police Community Support Officers (PCSOs) in Failsworth West – It was explained that resources allocation was subject to ongoing scrutiny and review. New recruiting was taking place and PCSOs deployed to other areas could intervene in Failsworth West when necessary.
- Effectiveness of the new model It was explained that an increased demand and less resources led to a model where responsibilities would be shared with all partner agencies and members of the public.

The District Executive thanked Greater Manchester Police representatives for the presentatives

Money management, 1st March to 31st May 2016

1. Background

1.1. Oldham CAB delivers debt advice sessions on a weekly basis in the Failsworth and Hollinwood District. These sessions alternate weekly between Failsworth Town Hall and Limehurst Library, complementing CAB sessions funded by Oldham Council that also alternate weekly ensuring weekly provision in both.

2. Performance

- 2.1. For the months of March, April and May we have helped a total of 123 people. This is made up of 70 in Failsworth and 53 in Limehurst. The figures indicate continued growth in residents coming to us for help and support.
- 2.2. The amount of debt rescheduled for this 3 month period is £35,902. The additional income raised through identifying eligible benefit payments totalled £46,230.

3. Further development

3.1. We have been told that the activation of the Freephone access to our Adviceline service in libraries has been delayed and will have been done by Unity by the 18th January 2016. This will ensure free access to from Monday to Friday (possible future extension to Evenings and weekends) within their community and fit seamlessly with the face to face service that will be focused on those that require more complex support.

Money management, 1st June to 30th June 2016

1. Background

1.1. Oldham CAB delivers debt advice sessions on a weekly basis in the Failsworth and Hollinwood District. These sessions alternate weekly between Failsworth Town Hall and Limehurst Library, complementing CAB sessions funded by Oldham Council that also alternate weekly ensuring weekly provision in both.

2. Performance

- 2.1. For the month of June we have helped a total of 56 people, 38 of these with detailed advice and support. This is made up of 29 in Failsworth and 27 in Limehurst. The figures indicate continued growth in residents coming to us for help and support.
- 2.2. The amount of debt rescheduled for this single month period is £28,221. The additional income raised through identifying eligible benefit payments totalled £19701.
- 2.3. The total number of residents helped in the last 12 months is 542. Debt rescheduled totals £175,327 and additional income through eligible benefits is£158,026.

3. Further development

3.1. Our current agreement is due to end and we are hopeful this service will be able to be supported again into 2017.

Briefing Note

Failsworth District Executive

Request for Double Yellow Lines, Medlock Road Woodhouses

1 Background

A request has been received from the residents of 120 Medlock Road, Woodhouses, for the introduction of yellow lines outside theirs and their neighbour's property, due to obstructive parking taking place, generated by patrons of the Dog and Partridge Pub.

The pub re-opened last year further to a period of refurbishment and although there is a large car park, its popularity means that the car park can become full and overspill parking can at times take place along Medlock Road, both outside the pub and the houses opposite. The residents initially contacted Unity Highways last year explaining that the parking outside their properties is causing them extreme difficulties seeing approaching traffic when trying to exit from their driveways and the parking opposite is causing the residents difficulty being able to manoeuvre off their driveways. The residents therefore requested that double yellow lines be introduced on both sides of the road, along the pub frontage and outside their properties, to alleviate the problem.

Observations undertaken last year in the area, at various times of the day and evening and on various days of the week, revealed that parking was taking place on both sides of the road. However, the level of parking was different on each visit and did not always generate the problems described. Observations were also undertaken along the full length of Medlock Road, within the village area, which revealed problematic parking occurring intermittently throughout Medlock Road. Photographs undertaken at the times of the observations are attached at Appendix A

Introducing double yellow lines, on both sides of the road, in the vicinity of the pub and the residents' properties would prevent any vehicle from

waiting, but this would also include residents and their visitors; double yellow lines would also displace parking to other locations possibly creating the same problems for other residents.

Due to the parking levels throughout the village and the displaced parking that could result from the introduction of double yellow lines, the matter was discussed with ward members for advice on how they wished to proceed. The feedback received was to monitor the situation for the time being, due to the popularity of the pub being re—opened.

2 Current Position

The parking problems reported last year seemed to die down for a period of time, but the resident at number 120 Medlock Road has recently made contact again with Unity Highways regarding the parking problems now being experienced again and has forwarded photographic evidence for consideration. The photos are attached at Appendix B.

The resident has explained that they confirm the exact times the parking takes place but it can vary from when the pub opens and can continue overnight. The parking can vary from anything from 12 noon until closing both on Saturdays and Sundays. Weekday parking generally starts from 5pm onwards. The resident has also stated that customers are also parking on the road even when the car park is empty.

The resident is now requesting that further consideration be given to the introduction of double yellow lines.

It is clear from the photos that have been supplied that parking can at times be problematic, however, observations recently undertaken on a weekend period have not revealed the obstructive parking taking place in the vicinity of the pub, but again footway parking was taking place along other sections of Medlock Road where residents rely on the highway for parking.


Due to the demand for highway parking, the introduction of double yellow lines in the vicinity of the Dog and Partridge pub could displace the overspill pub parking to outside the properties where residents rely on the highway for parking or could transfer the problem outside other residents' driveways.


Isolated short lengths of double yellow lines can also be difficult to enforce, which can lead to contraventions if regular enforcement is not undertaken.

3. Recommendation

Due to the parking levels throughout the village, the intermittent parking observed outside the pub and the displaced parking that could result from the introduction of double yellow lines, it is recommended that the District Executive advise how they feel the matter should be progressed.


