OLDHAM BOROUGH COUNCIL

LICENSING PANEL - ORDER OF PROCEEDINGS

The procedure outlined below, which was enclosed with the notice of hearing sent to each party, and a copy of which is before you today, will be followed.

Documentary evidence may be relied upon and considered by the Panel if it has been served on the Licensing Authority prior to the hearing, or if all parties consent it can be produced on the day of the hearing.

Any person wishing to call a witness to speak at the hearing must have applied in writing for permission from the Licensing Authority at least 2 working days before the hearing and must also have provided the name of the witness and a brief description of the points on which that person may be able to assist the authority in relation to their application, representations or notice. Any application to call a witness where the party has not given 2 working days' notice will be considered by the Panel at the beginning of the hearing and permission will not be unreasonably withheld.

Each party will have the same amount of time in which to address the Panel, each party will have up to 60 minutes to address the authority and give any further information (which must be relevant to that party's or another party's application or representation). Where any party considers this time to be insufficient then, a request in writing may be made to the Constitutional Services Officer for an extension of time at least two working days before the hearing; however this will not automatically be granted, and will be at the discretion of the Panel.

Any person behaving in a disruptive manner will be asked to leave the hearing, however, if this occurs that person will be entitled to submit in writing any information they would have been entitled to give orally.

The Authority will provide a record of the hearing in a permanent and intelligible form and keep it for 6 years from the date of determination or disposal of any Appeal.

Members are advised that they are making decisions in a quasi-judicial manner. As such, they have a duty to view all evidence presented before them impartially. Members must disregard any information given by a party which is not relevant to the promotion of the licensing objectives. The Panel is not bound by the formal rules of evidence. Nevertheless, Members must carry out their duty placing what weight they feel is appropriate given the nature of the evidence and the manner in which it was obtained, and communicated.

ORDER OF PROCEEDINGS

INTRODUCTION

The Constitutional Services Officer ("the Clerk") will welcome those present and outline the procedure to be followed (as set out below) and record those present. The Clerk will remind everyone that each party will have up to 60 minutes to address the Panel and give any further information.

APPLICATION

The Licensing Officer will outline the nature of the application.

The applicant and/or their representative to address the Panel, present additional information in support of the application (where consent to do so has been granted) and call any witnesses (subject to having given the required prior notice or having received permission at the beginning of the hearing). The Applicant and any witnesses may be questioned by Members of the Panel.

Any party, if given permission by the panel, may question the applicant and his witnesses, but this shall not take the form of cross examination.

REPRESENTATIONS

The Party making the representation and/or their representative to address the members of the Panel, providing any additional information in support of their representation (where consent to do so has been granted) and call any witnesses (subject to having given the required prior notice or having received permission at the beginning of the hearing). The party and any witnesses may be questioned by Members of the Panel.

In the event that a number of members of the public are present at the meeting who intend to make a representation in relation to the application as interested parties then the Chair has discretion to ask that they appoint a nominated spokesperson to present their representations.

Any party, if given permission by the panel, may question the party making representations and his witnesses, but this shall not take the form of cross examination.

These representations will be taken in the following order: -

- Police Representation (unless they are the applicant)
- Licensing Authority
- Environmental Health Representation
- Other Responsible Authorities Representation
- Public Representation (Interested Parties)

CLOSING STATEMENTS

The party making the representation may summarise their representation and make a closing statement.

The holder of the premises licence may summarise their representation and make a closing statement.

The Applicant may summarise the application and make a closing statement.

DETERMINATION

The Panel Members will leave the hearing to consider their decision in private. The panels may request the services of a legal representative and Constitutional Services Officer.

Review of Premises Licence following Review Notice Royal Oak, 496 Oldham Road, Failsworth, Oldham, M35 0EH

1 Background

Pursuant to Section 53C of the Licensing Act 2003, the purpose of this report is to ask Members to review the premises licence in respect of Royal Oak, 496 Oldham Road, Failsworth, Oldham, following the application for a 'Summary Review', of those premises, made by Greater Manchester Police on the 12th November 2018.

2 Recommendations

Members are recommended to consider the application, taking into account the information before them.

3 The Summary Review

- 3.1 An application for a Summary Review was submitted by PC 1684 Farrell in his capacity as the Licensing Officer for the borough of Oldham, endorsed by Superintendent Daniel Inglis of Greater Manchester Police, a copy of the application, and acompanying certificate is attached at **Appendix 1.**
- 3.2 The application outlines the reasons given for the summary review but in essence it is the view of Greater Manchester Police that the premises are associated with serious crime and / or disorder.
- 3.3 A copy of the existing Premises Licence is attached at **Appendix 2.**

A location map is attached at **Appendix 3**

4 Interim Steps

- 4.1 In accordance with Section 53B of the Licensing Act 2003, on Wednesday 14th November 2018, a duly constituted Licensing Panel considered whether it was necessary, based on the information before them, to take interim steps against the premises licence pending this review taking place.
- 4.2 Members of that Panel heard submissions from Greater Manchester Police and representatives of the Premises Licence Holder.

Having taken into account all the information before them, Members of the Panel took the decision to suspend the premises licence pending this full review taking place. A copy of the decision letter is attached at **Appendix 4**.

5 Review of Interim Steps

- 5.1 Once Members have made their decision on what action, if any, to take against the premises licence, a review of the Interim Steps must take place.
- 5.2 In reviewing the interim steps Members must:-

- a) consider whether the interim steps are appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives;
- b) consider any relevant representations; and
- c) determine whether to withdraw or modify the interim steps taken
- 5.3 If Members are minded to say the interim steps should continue but be modified, the options open to Members include:
 - a) the modification of the conditions of the premises licence;
 - b) the exclusion of the sale of alcohol by retail from the scope of the licence;
 - c) the removal of the designated premises supervisor from the licence;
 - d) the suspension of the licence;

6 Representations

One representation was received during the consultation period. The representation was made by Gosschalks Solicitors acting on behalf of their client El Group PLC who are the owners of the premises. The representation is attached at **Appendix 5**.

7 Secretary of State's Guidance

- 7.1 Chapter 11 of the guidance deals with reviews. Members attention is drawn to paragraphs 11.17 to 11.20 which provide:-
 - 11.17 The licensing authority may decide that the review does not require it to take any further steps appropriate to promoting the licensing objectives. In addition, there is nothing to prevent a licensing authority issuing an informal warning to the licence holder and/or to recommend improvement within a particular period of time. It is expected that licensing authorities will regard such informal warnings as an important mechanism for ensuring that the licensing objectives are effectively promoted and that warnings should be issued in writing to the licence holder.
 - 11.18 However, where responsible authorities such as the police or environmental health officers have already issued warnings requiring improvement either orally or in writing that have failed as part of their own stepped approach to address concerns, licensing authorities should not merely repeat that approach and should take this into account when considering what further action is appropriate. Similarly, licensing authorities may take into account any civil immigration penalties which a licence holder has been required to pay for employing an illegal worker.
 - 11.19 Where the licensing authority considers that action under its statutory powers is appropriate, it may take any of the following steps:
 - modify the conditions of the premises licence (which includes adding new conditions or any alteration or omission of an existing condition), for example, by reducing the hours of opening or by requiring door supervisors at particular times;
 - (ii) exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence, for example, to exclude the performance of live music or playing of recorded music (where it is not within the incidental live and recorded music exemption)₁₀;

- (iii) remove the designated premises supervisor, for example, because they consider that the problems are the result of poor management;
- (iv) suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months;
- (v) revoke the licence.

11.20 In deciding which of these powers to invoke, it is expected that licensing authorities should so far as possible seek to establish the cause or causes of the concerns that the representations identify. The remedial action taken should generally be directed at these causes and should always be no more than an appropriate and proportionate response to address the causes of concern that instigated the review.

7.2 A full copy of the guidance will be available at the hearing.

8 Licensing Policy

- 8.1 Members considering this application should take note of the Authority's Licensing Policy Statement when determining an application. In particular as crime and disorder were the basis of the summary review, attention should be drawn to Section 6 of the Policy.
- 8.2 A copy of the Policy will be available at the hearing.

9 **Options/Alternatives**

- 9.1 The options open to Members, having had regard to the information before them, including any verbal representations made by parties to the hearing, are
 - a) the modification of the conditions of the premises licence;
 - b) the exclusion of a licensable activity from the scope of the licence;
 - c) the removal of the designated premises supervisor from the licence; and
 - d) the suspension of the licence for a period not exceeding 3 months; and
 - e) the revocation of the licence.

Modification of the conditions of the premises licence can include the alteration or modification of existing conditions or addition of any new conditions, including those that restrict the times at which licensable activities authorised by the licence can take place.

- 9.2 Findings on any issues of fact should be on the balance of probability.
- 9.3 In arriving at a decision Members must have regard to the relevant provisions of national guidance and if applicable the licensing policy statement and reasons must be given for any departure.
- 9.4 The decision should be based on the individual merits of the application.

10 **Consultation**

- 10.1 There is no requirement to consult on interim steps.
- 10.2 In relation to the substantive hearing, consultation in accordance with the Act has commenced.

11 Legal Services Comments

11.1 In determining the application Members should have regard to the Authority's licensing policy statement and the Secretary of State's Guidance referred to in paragraph 7. The chief officer of police for the police area in which the premises are situated, the holder of the premises licence or any other person who made relevant representations in relation to the application for the review have a right of appeal to the Magistrates' court within the period of 21 days beginning with the day on which the appellant was notified by the licensing authority of the decision appealed against. Greater Manchester Police have received evidence of serious crime at the premises Royal Oak Hotel 496 Oldham Road, Failsworth, Manchester, M35 0EH.

On Saturday 10th November 2018 there was an incident of serious violence committed at the premises whereby a member of the public seriously assaulted. It was the professional opinion of medical personnel present that the victim had been assaulted with a knife causing a large cut to his thigh.

The injury was described by attending officers as a "gash down right side 2 inches deep 4 inches wide - muscle and bone exposed"

The victim denied being assaulted but stated he fell upon a glass within the premises. The attending paramedics advised that his injury was consistent with a knife. No members of the public were prepared to readily come forward and provide an account of what had gone on.

The police were informed of this incident by the Northwest Amublance Service, no call was received from staff at the premises.

There are no forensic opportunities to obtain evidence, as the scene was cleaned by pub staff prior to police arrival.

There was no DPS present on the night of the incident.

The following day Police Sergeant Archer attended at the premises and again the DPS was not present. A short time later Debbie Richardson arrived and stated that she was the DPS for the Royal Oak and had been present the night before but did not witness incident and had no knowledge as to what had happened, believing it had occurred outside of the venue.

There was no CCTV as the premise CCTV system was seized due to a serious assault occuring on the 13th October 2018. The DPS was not present on this occasion and staff were unable to operate the system so the

police were left with no alternative but to seize the entire system. This incident occurred 1 month ago and the premises have taken no action ot seek another system or make arrangements to have CCTV installed.

There is concern over the management of the premises at The Royal Oak and their capability to run the venue. The DPS and staff are unhelpful and reluctant to support policing objectives and therefore in turn the licensing objectives. There is a history of incidents and local police officers have tried to work together with the premises over time. Previous incidents will be referred to and drawn upon by the police at the final review hearing.

The criminal investigation is currently in its infancy, but due to the lack of cooperation from the victim and staff at the premises it is unlikely that the suspects will be identified and a successful prosecution brought.

There is no doubt that these incidents are of a very serious nature and patrons at the premises are at risk of serious injury or harm should further incidents occur. The premises do not deal with such matters by reporting them to the police or assisting the police, this in turn has led to a premises where individuals feel they can act in a manner where people can be seriously injured as in this case.

On Monday 12th November 2018 I have requested an expedited review take place, following this serious incident of crime.

Greater Manchester Police request that the licensing authority consider the suspension of the premises licence until the full review is heard before the committee.

I hereby certify that in my opinion the premises described below are associated with serious crime / serious disorder / both serious crime and serious disorder¹.

I am a Superintendent³ in the Greater Manchester police force.

I am giving this certificate because I am of the opinion that other procedures under the Licensing Act are inappropriate in this case, because⁴:

On Saturday 10th November 2018 at 00:51 hours police received a call from the Ambulance Service reporting that a male had been stabbed outside the Royal Oak on Oldham Road in failsworth.

Police attended and report that a male was being treated for a serious injury to his right thigh consisting of a 12inch long cut which was so deep that muscle and bone was exposed.

The victim denied being assaulted but stated he fell upon a glass within the premises. The attending paramedics advised that his injury was consistent with a knife.

The scene had been cleaned by staff at the premises prior to police arrival, no CCTV was available due to the system being previously seized as part of the investigation into a previous serious assault. The staff claim not to have witnessed anything.

It is apparent, that the management of the premises are failing to promote the licensing objectives of the prevention of crime and disorder.

I am satisfied that the conduct constitutes an offence for which a person aged 21 years of age or over with no previous convictions could reasonably be expected to be sentenced to imprisonment for 3 or more years as per section 81 (3) Regulation of Investigatory Powers Act 2000 (RIPA 2000).

The incident which occurred on Saturday 10th November 2018 raises concerns over the management of the premises and the ability of the Premises Licence Holder and Designated Premise Supervisor to promote the licensing objectives.

I have considered all powers available and feel that closure powers contained within Section 76 of the Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime & Policing Act 2014 are inappropriate due to the limited 48-hour closure not being sufficient to protect the public.

Section 51 of the Act in addition to the above is inappropriate due to the serious nature of the offences being investigated.

The powers contained under Section 53A the Licensing Act 2003 are appropriate to be exercised due to the above previously mentioned powers being inappropriate for the purposes of this review. There are real serious and immediate concerns that the mis-management of the premises is failing to promote the licensing objective of the prevention of crime and disorder. By failing to promote this licensing objective it has led to serious crime occurring at this premise and a serious life threatening injury to a patron of the premises.

In the interim Greater Manchester Police would request that the Licensing Authority consider suspension of the Premises Licence until the full review is heard before the committee. At that time all matters can be fully addressed whilst being able to consider all the necessary evidence.

Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

19 Mandatory conditions where licence authorises supply of alcohol

- (1) Where a premise licence authorises the supply of alcohol, the licence must include the following conditions.
 - (2) The first condition is that no supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence -
- (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- (3) The second condition is that every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

The following conditions came into force on 28th May 2014

- **1.** A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1-
- (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979(a);
- (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula-

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

where-

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence-
- (i) the holder of the premises licence.
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994 (b).

Mandatory Licensing Conditions from 1st October 2014

- **1.-**(1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises-
- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to-
- (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
- (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- **2.** The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- **3.**-(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either-
- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 4. The responsible person must ensure that-
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other

than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-

- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

General - all four licensing objectives

The entertainment proposed is no more than normal pub entertainment. I have considered the terms of the local licensing policy for Oldham Council and propose the following.

The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

As no "drinking up" time is allowed under the new policy I propose to serve the last drink 30 minutes before the terminal hour which will allow people ample time to consume their drinks and disperse orderly.

Public Safety

No capacity restriction is provided as risk assessment shows no risk of crowding.

The Prevention of Public Nuisance

Live music will end at 00:00, recorded music outdoors will end at 22:00. Recorded music indoors will be turned down at 00:00 to prevent nuisance to nearby neighbours.

For premises where entertainment frequently takes place, music and associated sources (including DJs, and amplified voices) should generally not be audible inside noise sensitive property at any time. Where entertainment takes place less frequently, such noise should not be audible inside noise sensitive property between 23.00 and 07.00 hours.

The Protection of Children from Harm

The current restrictions with regard to children will apply. No greater controls are required.

All children should be accompanied and supervised by an adult whilst on the premises.

All children under the age of 16 should be off the premises by 10:30pm.

Annex 4 - Embedded Conditions

On-licences Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours.

In this condition, permitted hours means:

g. On New Year's Eve from the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on the following day (or, if there are no permitted hours on the following day, midnight on 31st December).

The existing restrictions do not prohibit:

- (d) consumption of the alcohol on the premises or the taking of sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;
- (e) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
- (f) the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
- (g) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces:
- (h) the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or
- (i) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied; or
- (j) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

S.166 LA 1964

Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied unless it is paid for before **Licensed Premises** or at the time when it is sold or supplied, except alcohol sold or supplied:

- (a) with and for consumption at a meal supplied at the same time, consumed with the meal and paid for together with the meal;
- (b) for consumption by a person residing in the premises or his guest and paid for together with his accommodation;
- (c) to a canteen or mess.

We act on behalf of Ei Group Plc. Our client is the freeholder owner of these premises and we have just received details of the expedited review held on 14th November 2018. We understand that today is the last date for representations in respect of the full review.

We would be grateful if you would accept this letter as a formal representation on behalf of our client. Ei Group Plc owns around 4000 public houses in England and Wales. The company operates around 300 premises but the vast majority of its estate are the subject of lease/tenancy agreements by which the tenant operates his/her/its own business out of our client's premises. The lease/tenancy agreement makes it clear that all operational responsibility for the premises lies with the tenant. The Royal Oak is the subject of a 5 year agreement in favour of Debbie Richardson, a Director of Mia Call Limited (the premises licence holder). Ms Richardson has been responsible for the operation of these premises since March 2015.

Please note, that our client takes a wholly neutral stance with regard to the issues raised in the application for review. The purpose of this letter is to make representations with regard to the promotion of the licensing objectives moving forward.

We note from the information that we have received from the Police that there can be no certainty with regard to whether or not there was a stabbing or indeed the time of the incident that led to the injuries. In the circumstances, and without any certainty with regard to the time of any incident then the committee may not find it appropriate to determine that it would be appropriate to reduce the trading hours of the premises.

On the evidence that we have seen, it would appear that an appropriate and proportionate response would be to impose conditions on the premises licence relating to operation. It may also be



appropriate and proportionate (dependent upon the evidence) to remove the existing designated premises supervisor and require new management on site.

We reserve the right to expand upon matters raised within this letter of representation once we have seen any further evidence. At this stage, however we would be grateful if you would acknowledge receipt of this representation and advise as to the date of the hearing in order that we may discuss with out clients whether it wishes to be represented at the hearing.
