Station Road, Diggle – Proposed Revocation of Weight Restriction

Purpose of Report

The purpose of this report is to consider the revocation of the 18 tonne structural weight restriction from the Station Road, Diggle Railway Bridge, as the necessary structural repair works have now been undertaken by Network Rail.

Recommendation

It is recommended that the structural weight restriction be revoked, in accordance with the proposal at the end of this report.

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1 Background

- 1.1 An 18 tonne structural weight restriction was introduced along the railway bridge at Station Road, Diggle in 2018 further to Network Rail confirming the structural integrity of the bridge was compromised and in need of repair.
- 1.2 Network Rail has now confirmed that the necessary repairs have been completed and the bridge is now able to withstand a loading of 40 tonnes. Network Rail has therefore requested that the traffic order be revoked and the associated signing removed.

8 Legal Services Comments

- 8.1 The Council must be satisfied that it is expedient to make the Traffic Regulation Order revoking the existing restrictions in order to avoid danger to persons or other traffic using the road or any other road or for preventing the likelihood of any such danger arising, or for preventing damage to the road or to any building on or near the road, or for facilitating the passage on the road or any other road of any class of traffic, including pedestrians, or for preventing the use of the road by vehicular traffic of a kind which, or its use by vehicular traffic in a manner which, is unsuitable having regard to the existing character of the road or adjoining property or for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which the road runs.
- 8.2 In addition to the above, under section 122 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, it shall be the duty of the Council so to exercise the functions conferred on them by the Act as to secure the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of vehicular and other traffic (including pedestrians) and the provision of suitable and adequate parking facilities on and off the highway. Regard must also be had to the desirability of securing and maintaining reasonable access to premises, the effect on the amenities of any locality affected and the importance of regulating and restricting the use of roads by heavy commercial vehicles so as to preserve or improve the amenities of the areas through which the roads run, the strategy produced under section 80 Environmental Protection Act 1990 (the national air quality strategy), the importance of facilitating the passage of public service vehicles and of securing the safety and convenience of persons using or desiring to use such vehicles and any other matters appearing to the Council to be relevant.
