Reason for the decision:

To seek approval for awarding of the 12 Month extension option within the contract for the Erection, Maintenance and Dismantling of The Festive Illumination Displays for Oldham Council and Rochdale Borough Council

Summary:

Oldham Council and Rochdale Borough Council seek to continue the services of a specialist contractor to install, maintain and remove the Festive lighting across the boroughs.

The Festive lighting contract is a collaborative contract between Oldham Council and Rochdale Borough Council and is led by Oldham Council.

The service was jointly procured in 2017 and was successfully delivered and therefore both Authorities have agreed joint to secure this service for 2 years with an option to extend for another year.

contract currently utilised by both Oldham Council and Rochdale Borough Council and is led by Oldham Council. Both Councils have decided to continue to collaborate on this contract because they currently use the same incumbent service provider and have requirements for comparable service from the contract.

Christmas Plus Limited where awarded the contract to erect, maintain and remove the Festive Lights on 18th September 2017 with an option to extend for a further 12 months

The successful contractor has demonstrated

- A highly developed understanding of all aspects of Festive Lighting erection, maintenance and removal including associated disciplines
- A track record of delivering high quality professional services
- A socially engaged approach with real commitment to the community and its environment.
- Provide work experience for a local resident

The estimated Contract value is 30k per annum. The total annual contract for both Oldham and Rochdale Council is 60k

Option 1 – To award the optional 1-year extension to Christmas Plus Limited who have provided a high-quality service and shown a real commitment to both the Oldham and Rochdale community and environment

Option 2 – Not to award the optional 1-year extension to Christmas Plus Limited. Due to the need of the service and the value of the contract a new tender exercise would be required this would increase the timescales in appointing a new supplier and could impact on the installation of the Festive displays in both Oldham and Rochdale Council

Oldham Council has consulted with Rochdale Borough Council and involved the relevant departments at all stages of the process

Recommendation(s):

To approve option 1 – To award the optional 1year extension to Christmas Plus Limited how have provided a high-quality service and shown a real commitment to both Oldham and Rochdale Councils community and environment.

Implications:

What are the **financial** implications?

Costs incurred by Oldham Council under this contract extension will be met from an existing revenue budget resource of £29.2k held on the Christmas Decorations cost centre.

The cost of erecting and dismantling Oldham's Christmas Lighting displays in 2019/20 will be £21.9k leaving a balance of £7.3k to fund any repairs / variation of the displays.

Any costs incurred by Rochdale Council under this contract extension are not shared with Oldham Council and will be met directly by that authority.
