4. Achievements

The District Partnership through it's sub groups and partnerships have made progress across a number of the priorities above including:

Safe and Strong Communities

- We have continued to invest in initiatives to improve the appearance of villages and key sites across Saddleworth and Lees with summer planting and Christmas Lights
- We have continued to invest in crime reduction projects such as alley gating raising awareness of issues

- A project to resolve the issues at Churchill Playing Fields is now underway and due to be completed in Autumn 2012
- We have started work on the development of a project to improve the changing facilities at Churchill Playing Fields
- We have continued to support community events and engaged with local residents via community events and online PACTs
- We have invested in an effective Youth Only Zone and additional activity for Children and Young people including the development of Junior Youth Clubs
- We have continued to support and work with community groups to improve local buildings and facilities
- We have continued to support local cultural activities such as the Diggle Blues Festival,
 Whit Friday Band Contest and Huddersfield Canal Festival
- We have continued to support local Residents Associations develop local initiatives and projects
- We have continued to work together to improve traffic and transport issues across the district

Economic Prosperity

- We have invested in improvements to visitor information across the District
- We have invested in improved promotion of Saddleworth and Lees as tourist destination
- We have continued to invest in the Community toilet scheme for Saddleworth and Lees to support the visitor economy
- We are developing initiatives to support local businesses

Health & Wellbeing

- We have worked in partnership to support initiatives to reduce parental isolation and increase the uptake of support through local Children's Centres
- We have supported initiatives which encourage families to participate in healthy activities
- We are continuing to develop projects to tackle alcohol consumption and alcohol related hospital admissions
- We have supported initiatives to support vulnerable young people through targeted project
 work

Children Young People and Families

- We have worked to reduce parental isolation and increase uptake of support in Saddleworth and Lees by engaging parents in local Children's Centres
- We have identified projects to meet specific Saddleworth and Lees needs through local Children's Centres such as autism support groups and support for parents with multiple births
- We have increased access to counselling services in schools in Saddleworth and Lees
- We have worked to improve skills through dedicated training in response to need for the Saddleworth and Lees children young people and families workforce
