Anti social behaviour

Since the 1st January 2013 to present date there has been 301 incidents reported to the police and closed as Rowdy or Inconsiderate behaviour. This is compared with 376 incidents reported between the same dates the previous year (2012).

Reported nuisance by mini moto's also fell from 37 reported incidents in 2012 to 21 during the same period this year.

This is split between the three beats Failsworth West (119), Failsworth East (50) and finally Hollinwood (132).

The Limehurst Village area of Hollinwood has been experiencing the higher level of Anti social behaviour reports over the last few months, in particular the Lime Green Road, Lower and Higher Lime Road areas. The team led by the new Neighbourhood Beat Officer, PC Akram have put together a patrol plan in order to address this.

The area around KFC and TESCO on Failsworth West saw an increase in ASB at the beginning of the year. OP Samson was put in place and dealt with this issue.

As a result a cohort of individuals have been identified and the partnership are working together to establish interventions for each individual. Some of the lower levels have been warned where others have had enforcement action. The YIP and Integrated youth team are playing a part attempting to divert some of them in to more positive activities.

Due to the summer holidays fast approaching local NBO's and PCSO's are looking at arranging activities in order to divert some of the young people over the summer period. This will hopefully result in a notable drop of reported anti social behaviour incidents in the area.

We are looking at having a dedicated anti social behaviour car over the summer months to visit the anti social behaviour hot spot areas. This was done in previous years as a dedicated resource with district partnership funding and worked well with some pleasing results.

Comparison Figures.

Robbery, burglary dwelling and violent crime are all showing a reduction. Vehicle crime has shown a slight increase.

A robbery patrol plan has been implemented to include high visible patrols along the Failsworth Canal which has been highlighted as a hot spot.

Local businesses have also been canvassed into forming a business watch.

Neighbourhood staff has held regular surgeries at local supermarkets where crime prevention advice has been offered regarding leaving properties insecure during warm weather and leaving property in vehicles on display.

A number of initiatives around fitting tamper proof screws have been held due to the recent spike in theft of number plates.

Serious acquisitive crime offences

You will see from the breakdown of figures above that serious acquisitive crime has reduced when compared with the same period last year. This does not mean we should be complacent in our approach to dealing with this crime type. We are not resting on our laurels and have at this moment in time an Operation called Op Galaxy ongoing all over the borough targeting Vehicle Crime and Burglaries.

Violent Crime

As you can see violent crime has decrease on our neighbourhood. The team have commenced increased patrols before and after school patrols to try and prevent any incidents occurring and to engage with staff at the school's as well as pupils and parents. This has resulted in a decrease of crimes relating to young people on young people of

school age. We have had some excellent feedback so far on these additional patrols. The officers will continue going in to schools and engaging pupils in dialogue around violent crime.

Regular visits to problem licensed premises have also helped to reduce drink related violence.

Pro-active work

22 various warrants have been executed leading to the recovery of drugs and stolen property.

Public confidence and awareness

Confidence in the Police service remains high for our neighbourhood. The Police station is closed to the public at Failsworth. However officers still work from the station and respond to public concerns when required. Our Facebook page has 3025 followers and is going from strength to strength. We also have 2066 Twitter followers. These are updated on a daily basis and often whilst the officers are out and about in their communities.

Feedback and comments from the community have been very positive especially when appeals have been placed for information.

Due to the demand more staff have now been trained on both the
