Anti-social behaviour (ASB) includes a range of issues. Behaviour can be anti-social because it is capable of causing nuisance or annoyance to both individuals and the wider community.

Within the Borough of Oldham we have a strong partnership lead approach to tackling ASB and the causes of it preventing it from reoccurring. This partnership approach includes police, local authorities and social landlords. These agencies have wide ranging powers to effectively tackle this problem.

## Crime Prevention Advice

### **DON'T BE LEFT OUT IN THE COLD THIS WINTER!**

With early mornings becoming colder and frostier, don't let yourself fall foul of car crime. Every year there is an increase in the number of Theft from Motor Vehicles and Theft of Motor Vehicles.

This is due to people leaving their vehicle unattended and unlocked with the engine running, to defrost the car, while they have their breakfast or get ready for work. Remember it only takes a matter of seconds to sneak in to an unattended vehicle, especially in the dark mornings.

The worst part of these crimes is that **SOME INSURANCE COMPANIES DO NOT PAY OUT DUE TO NEGLIGENCE**. It isn't worth the risk!

It might take an extra 5 minutes to get to work by defrosting your vehicle, but at least you are not risking losing it.

## DEFROSTING YOUR CAR - THE FACTS

Crime statistics from winter 2012/13...

1. December and January is peak months were most vehicles are stolen as a result of the victim leaving keys in the ignition whilst defrosting their car.
2. Oldham is the third worst division in GMP when it comes to vehicles being stolen as a result of defrosting with Rochdale having the highest number.
3. Peak times are between 07:00am and 09:00am
4. Peak days are Monday and Tuesdays.



## REDUCE PROPERTY CRIME

Thousands of items of property are lost or stolen each year in the UK. The Immobilise National Property Register already holds the details of 20 million items of property and to help the police stop property crime.

## REGISTER

MAIL Register your property for free at [www.immobilise.com](http://www.immobilise.com), it only takes a couple of minutes and once you have registered you will have a better chance of getting your property back if it is lost or stolen.

## REPORT

If any item of registered property is lost or stolen report it to immobilise via your online account. This information is then made available nationally all the major UK Police Forces via their online systems.

## REUNITE

If your registered property is recovered either the Police or Immobilise will contact you and let you know its location

**Mobile phone thieves will go to extreme lengths to get their hands on your phone, not to mention the private photos, videos and personal information that may be stored on it.**

**KEEP IT SAFE:**

- Keep your phone out of sight in public areas and never leave it unattended
- Use a password or PIN to protect your phone
- Keep a record of your IMEI as you will need this if it is stolen - press \*#06# into your keypad or ring your network provider
- Write your postcode on your phone using a UV pen and register it for free on [immobilise.com](http://immobilise.com). This will make it easier to return to you if it is stolen
- Install a tracking app on your smartphone - visit [www.gmp.police.uk/wheresyours](http://www.gmp.police.uk/wheresyours) for more advice
- If your phone is stolen, call your network or 08701 123 123 to get it blocked

**Mobile phones are easy targets for thieves. Follow the advice below to minimise the chance of theft:**

- Keep your phone hidden in public places.
- Your phone will have security built in – like additional security codes. Use them.
- Only give your number to family, and to friends that you trust.
- If your plans change, send a new text to keep people updated on where you are.
- If alone, set your phone to vibrate so that it doesn't attract attention.
- If you take a lift or taxi, text the registration number to someone that you trust
- Most phones allow 999 calls even if you have no credit left or have the keypad locked.
- Dial \*#06# for your phone's serial number and keep this in a safe place.

Use an ultra-violet marker pen to label your phone  
Register it with [Immobilise](http://Immobilise) - the UK's National Register
