Anti-social behaviour

Anti-social behaviour (ASB) includes a range of issues. Behaviour can be anti-social because it is capable of causing nuisance or annoyance to both individuals and the wider community.

Within the Borough of Oldham we have a strong partnership led approach to tackling ASB and the causes of it preventing it from reoccurring. This partnership approach includes police, local authorities and social landlords. These agencies have wide ranging powers to effectively tackle this problem.

Anti-Social Behaviour Issues Update:

We have had a decrease in ASB reported to the police over the last couple of weekends.

Isolated incidents reported

The Metrolink Stop on Hardman Lane and an incident on Alder Road with youth starting fires during the early evening time .

We have had incidents of ASB reported, at locations such as Morrison's, Tesco's and The Millgate public house. The later location has been a repeat caller reporting youths on the roof of the building. We identified some culprits and they were taken home and advised in the presence of parents.

A policing patrol plan remains in place in Failsworth to help combat ASB in the area .There has been a marked fall in ASB reports at the St Johns Church / Church Street area.

Particular areas our officers pay attention to are as follows:

- Failsworth Higher Memorial park and the retail zone.
- Hoys shop on Ashton Road East junction Church Street.
- Failsworth Pole area particularly to the side of the Crown and Cushion.
- Car Park at the side of the Royal Oak Failsworth Pole.
- Grounds of St Johns Church Oldham Road.

Our Policing style is open, firm and fair and in proportion to the situation / Incident that we are facing at the time.

The Street pastor team and the detached youth workers are our partners and should be viewed by all staff participating in this initiative as essential components supporting the overall objective of reducing ASB. In effect we have around 10 extra pairs of eyes out on the ground and they are a valuable resource.

Failsworth Neighbourhood Policing Team in Partnership With Oldham Council

On May 9th 2016 a new policing model came into operation.

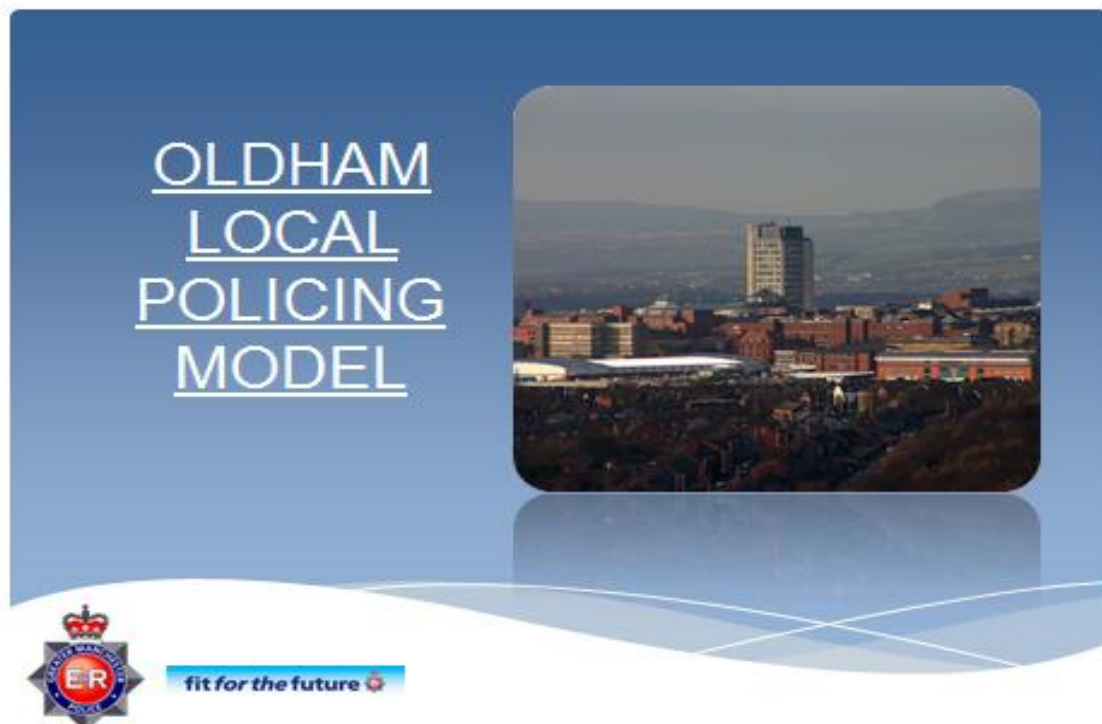
As part of the new Neighbourhood model implementation at Oldham Pc Lee Cullen moved from the NBO role for Failsworth West. PC Mohammed Kashif (mohammed.kashif@gmp.police.uk) has replaced him as the NBO for Failsworth West. The new policing model will move to better integration between Police, local Council and the voluntary sector.

Under the new policing review the weekly Failsworth Policing patrol plan will continue as normal , Failsworth West NBO Mohammed Kashif will collate and disseminate the document.

OLDHAM LOCAL POLICING MODEL

More Police / PCSO's on the streets of Failsworth Hollinwood & Limeside!!!

On May 9th 2016 a new policing model came into operation. Response Officers will no longer exist instead they will be Neighbourhood Police Officers and will be allocated to an area. This means that when they are not dealing with emergencies they will default to their areas. This should mean more Officers in Failsworth , Hollinwood & Limeside .

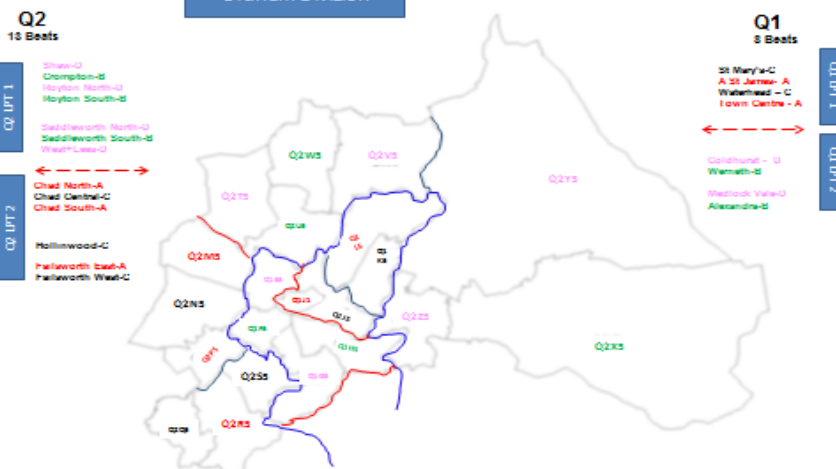

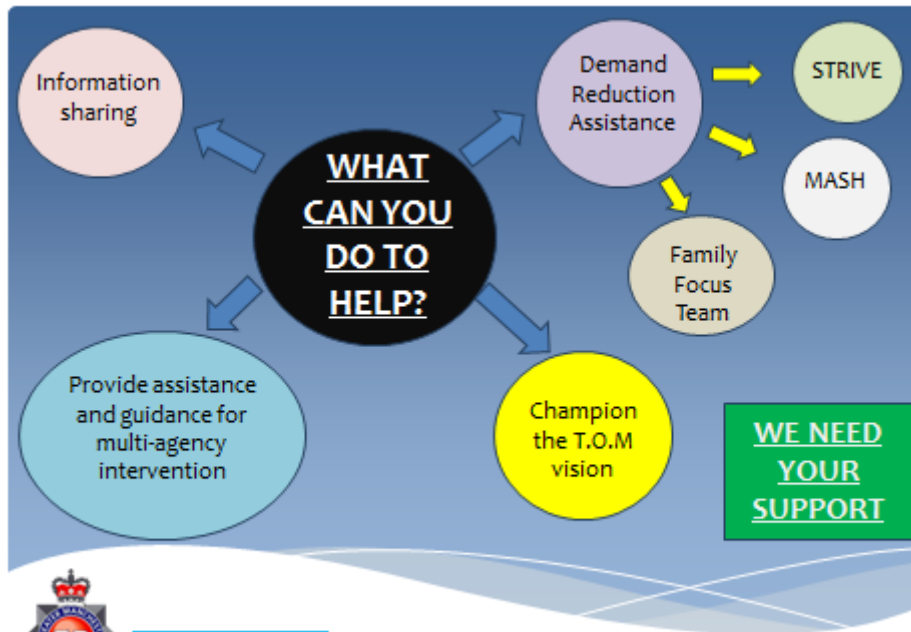

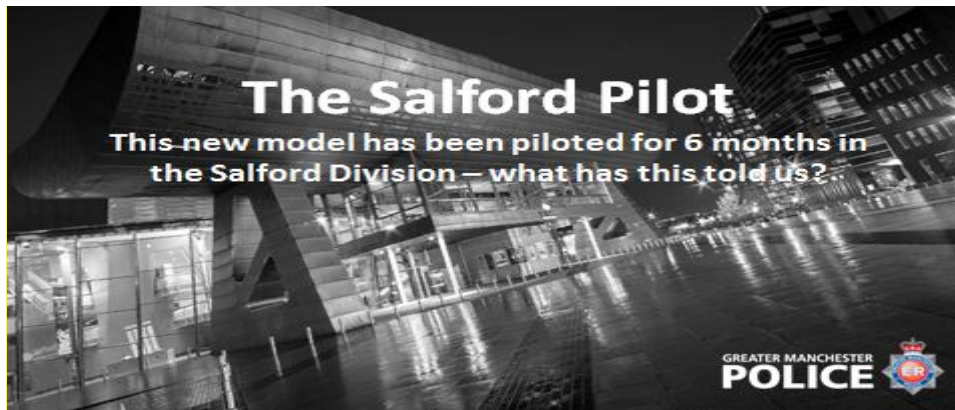

Crime Prevention Advice

Homes with no security measures in place are five times more likely to be burgled than those with simple security measures. Good window locks and strong deadlocks can make a big difference.

Taking just a few steps can make a big difference in keeping your home safe from burglary. Here are a few tips:

Lock your doors and windows every time you leave the house, even when you're just out in the garden, remembering to double-lock UPVC doors (lift handle and turn key)

1. Hide all keys, including car keys, out of sight and away from the letterbox (remember a device could be used to hook keys through the letterbox)
- 2. Install a visual burglar alarm**
3. Install good outside lighting
- 4. Get a trusted neighbour to keep an eye on your property**
5. Leave radios or lights in your house on a timer to make the property appear occupied
- 6. Make sure the fences around your garden are in good condition**
7. Secure bikes at home by locking them to an immovable object inside a locked shed or garage
- 8. Keep ladders and tools stored away; don't leave them outside where they could be used to break into your home**
9. Ensure side gates are locked to prevent access to the rear of the property
- 10. Ensure rear fencing is in good repair**
Improve natural surveillance at the front of your property i.e. trim high hedges
- 11. Mark your property with postcode and house number and register your property for free with [Immobilise](#)**
12. Consider joining or forming a [Neighbourhood Watch scheme](#)
- 13. Remove valuables from view of ground floor windows**
14. Store any high value items (i.e. jewellery, passports) in a properly secured safe or bank vault
