Within the Borough of Oldham we have a strong partnership led approach to tackling ASB and the causes of it preventing it from reoccurring. This partnership approach includes police, local authorities and social landlords. These agencies have wide ranging powers to effectively tackle this problem.

Three arrested in connection with a hate incident on a tram in Manchester City Centre.

The incident happened at around 7.40am this morning, Tuesday 28 June, on a tram travelling towards the city centre and police were made aware after a video of the incident surfaced online.

Two men aged 20 and 18 and a 16-year-old boy have been arrested on suspicion of affray.

They remain in police custody for questioning.

Chief Inspector Gareth Parkin of GMP's City of Manchester Team, said:

“I would like to thank the public for their help and support in this investigation, which has led to the swift arrest of these three people.

Failsworth Neighbourhood Policing Team Working In Partnership With Oldham Council

The Failsworth , Hollinwood & Limeside Neighbourhood Team work in partnership with the Street Pastors, our unofficial spoc for the street pastors is PcsO Mark Ravenscroft. Graham Radcliffe is the Coordinator for Oldham South Street Pastors. PcsO Ravenscroft liaises regular with the street pastors and provides reports regarding previous weekends issues and updates the Pastors of the current hotspots and any pre-arranged gatherings we are aware of and in return the team lets us know of any intel they have gathered from the evening patrols. PcsO Ravenscroft will also let Failsworth school know if any of their pupils are amongst the youths the street pastors talk to, especially if there is any suspected involvement with drink or drugs.

Burglary Other Than A Dwelling

An offender was identified via CCTV and charged for a burglary at a Dental Lab the offender is on bail until 09/08/16.

An offender was forensically linked to a burglary at a Chip shop in Failsworth. When arrested further stolen property was located linking him to a further 3 breaks in the area. The offender's girlfriend was also arrested at the location for burglary. The offender was charged with the Burglary at the Chip shop and received 12 weeks in custody.

Two offenders arrested in connection with burglaries at a hairdressers

Three offenders arrested for a burglary at butchers but were not charged due to insufficient evidence and the victim not supporting a prosecution.

Shop Lifting



Frank Booth ROWELL, 45 years, of Moorcroft Street, Oldham was sentenced on 23 June at Oldham Magistrates Court for 3 offences of shoplifting at various stores in Hollinwood. He received a total of 20 Months for 3 offences.

Possession Of A Knife

Male was detained and found in possession of a knife and a hammer after trying to gain entry via 1st floor rear window of an empty shop on Hollins Road, Oldham.

Breach Of Community Behaviour Order

Male arrested and charged with breach of Community Behavioural Order, Committed he received a prison sentence for 3 weeks suspended for 12 months.

We have already seen an increase in reports of ASB around the local areas and our Neighbourhood Officers and PCSOs are providing additional patrols to try and tackle these issues.

Antisocial behaviour is an aggressive and destructive activity that intimidates, threatens and causes distress.

Examples include:

Rowdy/Noisy Behaviour

Dealing or buying drugs on the street

Street Drinking

Vandalism, Graffiti and Fly-posting

Illegally riding off-road Bikes

ASB damages the life quality of individuals, families and communities.

Penalties include an ASBO, CBO, Fines, and Arrest/Imprisonment just to name a few.

Please speak to your children about Antisocial Behaviour.
