# Proposed Stopping Up of Highway – Part of Hawthorn Road, Oldham

### **Purpose of Report**

The purpose of this report is to consider the stopping up of part of a turning head facility at Hawthorn Road, Oldham.

### Recommendation

It is recommended that part of the turning head of Hawthorn Road, Oldham be stopped up in accordance with the schedule at the end of this report, under powers contained in Section 116 of the Highways Act 1980.

### **Delegated Decision**

### Proposed Stopping Up of Highway – Part of Hawthorn Road, Oldham

### 1 Background

- 1.1 In October 2009 temporary planning consent was granted for 2 years for a modular building to be sited within part of the turning head facility of Hawthorn Road, Oldham.
- 1.2 The development was to provide facilities for a community health care facility, until a permanent facility was provided at Clive Road, Oldham. The opening of the new medical centre was delayed and a further temporary consent was granted in 2013 for the building to remain for an additional 3 years.
- 1.3 The building was erected within part of the adopted turning head facility, under the conditions of a temporary traffic order. As the facility was approved under temporary consent, it was not considered necessary to stop up part of the highway permanently, as it was always the intention for the building to be removed. However, the modular building was not removed and the ownership of the building has now transferred from the NHS to the Council.
- 1.4 As the building is in good condition the Council has taken the view that instead of removing the building an alternative use should be found. The site has been marketed and the successful bidder proposes to use the building as a children's day nursey.
- 1.5 As the building is to remain, the piece of highway that it is positioned on needs to be stopped up and an alternative piece of land provided as adopted highway to maintain an adequate turning head facility.
- 1.6 Drawing number 439/A4/650/1 shows the area of highway to be stopped up together with the area of land which will be the replacement turning head facility. The highway is to be stopped up under powers contained in Section 116 of the Highways Act 1980.

4.1 In view of the change in use of the former NHS building to a children's nursery it is felt that part of the adopted turning head should be stopped up and a replacement area provided for vehicular turning movements, in accordance with drawing number 439/A4/650/1.

### 7 Legal Services Comments

7.1 Section 116 of the Highways Act 1980 enables the Council as highway authority to apply to the magistrates' court for an order stopping up a highway on the grounds that the highway is unnecessary. The magistrates have to be satisfied that the highway in question is unnecessary for the sort of purposes which the magistrates would reasonably expect the public to use that particular way.
