The reason for this report is to provide Members with feedback from the private hire trade following a consultation on the proposed Executive Hire Policy.

#### **Executive Hire Policy**

## 1. Background

- 1.1 Over recent years, the private hire trade has become more diverse and there is now a much wider range of vehicles and services available to customers/passengers.
- 1.2 It is important that policies recognise the wide range of private hire services that are now available, and have a licensing regime in place that facilitates the licensing of businesses which operate professionally and safely. At the same time the licensing regime should offer adequate protection to prevent the licensing and operation of businesses which are non-compliant and do not offer the necessary level of public protection.
- 1.3 The main distinction between standard and Executive Private Hire can broadly be described as the type of client catered for, the type of service offered, and the cost of the service provided. Drivers of Executive Private Hire Vehicles must hold a valid private hire drivers licence issued by the same local authority that issued the Executive vehicle and operator licence. The legislation requires that all licensed drivers (private hire and hackney carriage) are fit and proper to hold such a licence. The standards required by the Licensing Authority in terms of driving skills, medical fitness, criminal/motoring convictions, knowledge of licensing requirements, safeguarding and regional topography knowledge is deemed to be same for both standard and Executive Private Hire drivers.

#### 2 Current Position

- 2.1 The proposed Executive Hire Policy attached at Appendix 1 went out for consultation to the private hire trade on Monday 1<sup>st</sup> October 2018 for a period of 28 days. At the time of writing this report, the consultation period is still open and due to close on Sunday 28<sup>th</sup> October 2018. The responses will then be collated and analysed.
