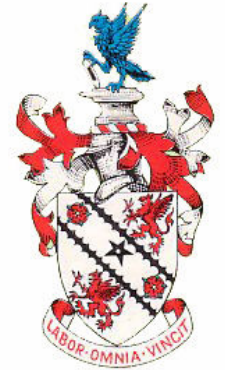

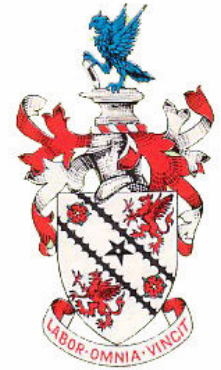

NEIGHBOURHOOD ACTION PLAN

The idea of having neighbourhood plans is to focus agencies activities not just on current issues but over 12 months. The plan would be reviewed monthly to keep it up to date and monitor progress.

The Area Committees already have an action plan and some contents will form the basis of neighbourhood plans. The Area Committee action plan has a total of ten heading areas that mirror the community strategy themes however it has been suggested by the Chadderton Councillors that fewer themes should be used to concentrate the work of the Area Committee.

The most commonly mentioned areas of concern from residents are youth nuisance and lack of activities, cleanliness of the area and wanting more Police presence.

A discussion with Chadderton Elected Members regarding the Area Committee's action plan and how the Area Action Team supports it took place and it was agreed to concentrate on three of the Community Strategy themes:

- Community Safety
- Children and Young People
- Environment and Transport.

The neighbourhood plan will be a multi-agency approach.

Within the Community Safety theme the elements of the Oldham Against Crime Partnership's Opportunities Strategy will be used to prevent duplication and show links to Oldham Partnership.
