LICENSING PANEL - ORDER OF PROCEEDINGS

The procedure outlined below, which was enclosed with the notice of hearing sent to each party, and a copy of which is before you today, will be followed.

Documentary evidence may be relied upon and considered by the Panel if it has been served on the Licensing Authority prior to the hearing, or if all parties consent it can be produced on the day of the hearing.

Any person wishing to call a witness to speak at the hearing must have applied in writing for permission from the Licensing Authority at least 2 working days before the hearing and must also have provided the name of the witness and a brief description of the points on which that person may be able to assist the authority in relation to their application, representations or notice. Any application to call a witness where the party has not given 2 working days' notice will be considered by the Panel at the beginning of the hearing and permission will not be unreasonably withheld.

Each party will have the same amount of time in which to address the Panel, each party will have up to 60 minutes to address the authority and give any further information (which must be relevant to that party's or another party's application or representation). Where any party considers this time to be insufficient then, a request in writing may be made to the Constitutional Services Officer for an extension of time at least two working days before the hearing; however this will not automatically be granted, and will be at the discretion of the Panel.

Any person behaving in a disruptive manner will be asked to leave the hearing, however, if this occurs that person will be entitled to submit in writing any information they would have been entitled to give orally.

The Authority will provide a record of the hearing in a permanent and intelligible form and keep it for 6 years from the date of determination or disposal of any Appeal.

Members are advised that they are making decisions in a quasi-judicial manner. As such, they have a duty to view all evidence presented before them impartially. Members must disregard any information given by a party which is not relevant to the promotion of the licensing objectives. The Panel is not bound by the formal rules of evidence. Nevertheless, Members must carry out their duty placing what weight they feel is appropriate given the nature of the evidence and the manner in which it was obtained, and communicated.

ORDER OF PROCEEDINGS

INTRODUCTION

The Chair will welcome those present and outline the procedure to be followed (as set out below) and the Clerk will record those present. The Clerk will remind everyone that each party will have up to 60 minutes to address the Panel and give any further information.

APPLICATION

The Licensing Officer will outline the nature of the application.

The applicant and/or their representative to address the Panel, present additional information in support of the application (where consent to do so has been granted) and call any witnesses (subject to having given the required prior notice or having received permission at the beginning of the hearing). The Applicant and any witnesses may be questioned by Members of the Panel.

Any party, if given permission by the panel, may question the applicant and his witnesses, but this shall not take the form of cross examination.

REPRESENTATIONS

The Party making the representation and/or their representative to address the members of the Panel, providing any additional information in support of their representation (where consent to do so has been granted) and call any witnesses (subject to having given the required prior notice or having received permission at the beginning of the hearing). The party and any witnesses may be questioned by Members of the Panel.

In the event that a number of members of the public are present at the meeting who intend to make a representation in relation to the application as interested parties then the Chair has discretion to ask that they appoint a nominated spokesperson to present their representations.

Any party, if given permission by the panel, may question the party making representations and his witnesses, but this shall not take the form of cross examination.

These representations will be taken in the following order: -

- Police Representation (unless they are the applicant)
- Licensing Authority
- Environmental Health Representation
- Other Responsible Authorities Representation
- Public Representation (Interested Parties)

CLOSING STATEMENTS

The party making the representation may summarise their representation and make a closing statement.

The holder of the premises licence may summarise their representation and make a closing statement.

The Applicant may summarise the application and make a closing statement.

DETERMINATION

Licensing Act 2003 – Application for a Variation of a Premises Licence for Greene's Bistro and Parlour, Wade Road, Uppermill, Oldham OL3 6BA

1. Purpose of Report

1.1 The purpose of this report is to inform Members of an application for the variation of a premises licence in respect of Greene's Bistro and Parlour, Wade Road, Uppermill, Oldham OL3 6BA which, due to representations being received, has been referred to this Panel for determination.

2. Recommendations:

2.1 Members are recommended to consider the application taking into account the representations received.

3. The Application

3.1 On the 8th April 2025, the applicant Grandpa Greene's Uppermill Ltd., applied for variation of a premises licence in respect of the premises Greene's Bistro and Parlour, Wade Road, Uppermill, Oldham OL3 6BA.

The last date for representations in relation to this application was 6th May 2025.

3.2 Details of the proposed variations are as follows:

4. Representations

4.1 Following the submission and advertisement of the application representations were received. These can be found in **Appendix 14.3 to 14.7** to the report.



5. Licensing Policy

5.1 Members considering this application should take note of the Authority's Licensing Policy Statement. Attention should be drawn to page 7, Prevention of Crime and Disorder, and page 11, Public Safety, and page 13, Prevention of Public Nuisance and page 15, Protection of Children from Harm.

5.2 In relation to 'Public Nuisance' the following paragraph(s) provide:-

8.2 When addressing public nuisance, the applicant should initially identify any particular issues (having regard to their particular type of premises and/or activities), which are likely to adversely affect the promotion of the public nuisance objective. Such steps as are required to deal with these identified issues should be included within the applicants operating schedule.

8.3 If relevant representations are received, the Authority may impose conditions to prevent nuisance, noise, disturbance, light pollution, noxious smells, vermin and pest infestations and accumulations of rubbish and litter.

8.8 Conditions may include restrictions on the times when music or other licensable activities may take place and may include technical restrictions on sound levels at the premises. Conditions may be imposed requiring licensees to display signs at all exits of premises reminding customers to leave premises quietly and to respect the rights of nearby residents.

5.2 A full copy of the Councils Licensing Policy Statement will be available at the hearing.

6. Secretary of State's Guidance

6.1 Members also need to consider statutory guidance issued, by the Secretary of State, under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 (February 2025).

6.2 Chapter 2 of the guidelines deals with the Licensing Objectives and potential measures licence holders and the licensing authority should consider so they are not being undermined.

In relation to 'Crime & Disorder' the following paragraph(s) provide:

2.1 Licensing authorities should look to the police as the main source of advice on crime and disorder. They should also seek to involve the local Community Safety Partnership (CSP).

2.3 Conditions should be targeted on deterrence and preventing crime and disorder...For example, where there is good reason to suppose that disorder may take place, the presence of closed-circuit television (CCTV) cameras both inside and immediately outside the premises can actively deter disorder, nuisance, anti-social behaviour and crime generally. Some licence holders may wish to have cameras on their premises for the prevention of crime directed against the business itself, its staff, or its customers. But any condition may require a broader approach, and it may be appropriate to ensure that the precise location of cameras is set out on plans to ensure that certain areas are properly covered and there is no subsequent dispute over the terms of the condition.

In relation to 'Public Safety', the following paragraph provide:-

2.16 Licence holders should make provision to ensure that premises users safely leave their premises. Measures that may assist include:



- Providing information on the premises of local taxi companies who can provide safe transportation home; and
- Ensuring adequate lighting outside the premises, particularly on paths leading to and from the premises and in car parks.

In relation to 'Public Nuisance', the following paragraphs provide:-

- 2.25 Where applications have given rise to representations, any appropriate conditions should normally focus on the most sensitive periods. For example, the most sensitive period for people being disturbed by unreasonably loud music is at night and into the early morning when residents in adjacent properties may be attempting to go to sleep or are sleeping. This is why there is still a need for a licence for performances of live music between 11pm and 8am. In certain circumstances, conditions relating to noise emanating from the premises may also be appropriate to address any disturbance anticipated as customers enter and leave.
- 2.27 Beyond the immediate area surrounding the premises, these are matters for the personal responsibility of individuals under the law. An individual who engages in anti-social behaviour is accountable in their own right. However, it would be perfectly reasonable for a licensing authority to impose a condition, following relevant representations, that requires the licence holder or club to place signs at the exits from the building encouraging patrons to be quiet until they leave the area, or that, if they wish to smoke, to do so at designated places on the premises and to respect the rights of people living nearby to a peaceful night.

In relation to 'Protecting of children from harm', the following paragraphs provide:-

- 2.28 The protection of children from harm includes the protection of children from moral, psychological, and physical harm. This includes not only protecting children from the harms associated directly with alcohol consumption but also wider harms such as exposure to strong language and sexual expletives (for example, in the context of exposure to certain films or adult entertainment). Licensing authorities must also consider the need to protect children from sexual exploitation when undertaking licensing functions.
- 2.32 Licensing authorities and responsible authorities should expect applicants, when preparing an operating schedule or club operating schedule, to set out the steps to be taken to protect children from harm when on the premises.

6.3 A full copy of the guidance will be available at the hearing.

7. Options/ Alternatives

7.1 When determining the application Members, having had regard to the representations, may take such steps as they consider appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. The steps available to Members are:

- a. Grant the application as applied for
- b. Grant the application but modify the operating schedule in relation to hours, days, conditions, or activities
- c. Reject the application



7.2 Any steps appropriate to promote the licensing objectives should be specified. If none of the steps are appropriate and proportionate, no action should be taken.

7.3 Findings on any issues of fact should be on the balance of probability.

7.4 In arriving at a decision Members must have regard to the relevant provisions of national guidance and the licensing policy statement and reasons must be given for any departure.

7.5 The decision should be based on the individual merits of the application.

8. Consultation

8.1 Consultation in accordance with the Act has taken place with all responsible bodies and notice has been given to allow for any representations from interested parties.

9. Legal Services Comments

9.1 In determining the application Members should have regard to the Authority's licensing policy statement and the Secretary of State's Guidance. The applicant or any other person who made relevant representations in relation to the application have a right of appeal to the Magistrates' court. (A Evans)

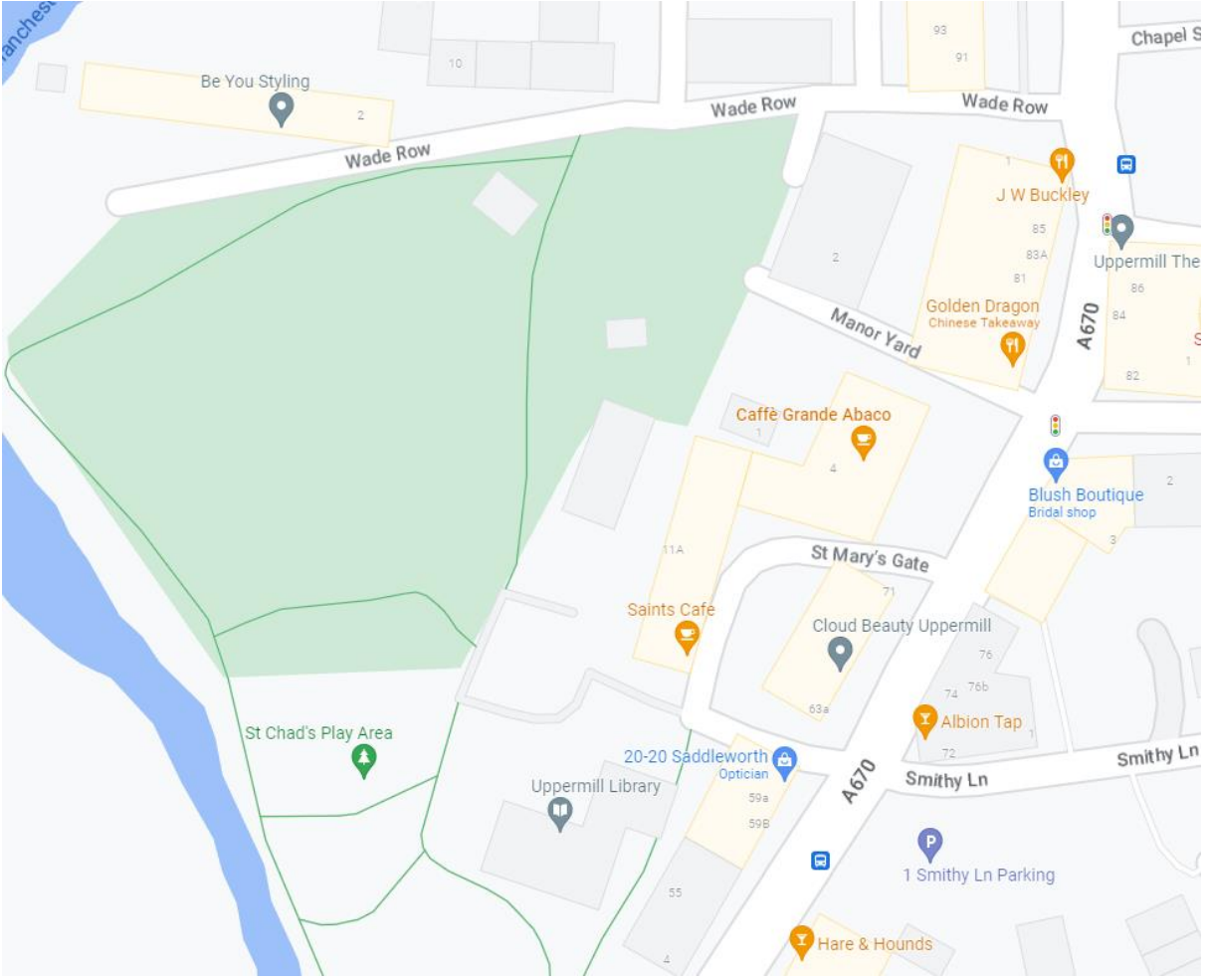

I don't agree with having extended hours of alcohol consumption within a park is morally acceptable. It is not within the Authorities power to police people who have consumed alcohol from entering a park, however promoting and supporting such is a different proposition. No other park in the entire Borough has a licensed premises within it for obvious reasons.

The planning application planning and heritage statement claimed – “The café will continue to operate daytime only (9am to 7pm) and as such the amenity of the neighbouring properties will be protected” however numerous attempts have been made to vary the business model to include alcohol sales from the start of the business operating. By referencing ‘neighbouring properties will be protected’ at planning stage the applicant recognises that longer opening hours can cause potential harm. The neighbouring properties are occupied by families and elderly residents, one such block being only meters (15) from the premises and the bin store (noisy especially when bottles are being emptied). Despite this an application for an alcohol license was granted, along with numerous special event licenses since the business began operating.

What has to be recognised is that the business was marketed as an ice cream parlour/café. It is now a fully fledged restaurant with an ancillary ice cream take away facility – all of which is located on a public and protected by way of a trustee arrangement, park. A park that attracts large numbers of children.

Given the application looks to increase the hours of operation there is an increased potential risk of people who have consumed alcohol, in a thriving village with numerous licensed premises, having to use the park (the only central part of the

village where the nighttime economy does not directly impact) to make their way to and from the premises.

The application must be seen in a context of the planning conditions – there are regular and consistent breaches of the original statements – deliveries do not always take place before 9am, they regularly block the roads and access to a single access row of homes, customers and staff regularly park on restricted areas (yellow lines) and block drives. The much-touted Access, Parking and Deliveries Management Plan has never been adhered to – it is a regular occurrence that deliveries park on double yellows, drag crates across Wade Row in and around 7am (this morning before 7am) and wake up residents rather than use the gates – guess this would take too much time for the drivers – extract from the plan below –

“The proposal will not add to the existing situation as all deliveries to the proposed café will take place from within the park itself. Informal agreement has been reached with the Council to allow delivery access only to the café through the park gates on Wade Row. Grandpa Greene’s will be given a set of keys to lock and unlock the park gates. This access will only be used between the hours of 8am and 9am each day of the week when there is low use of the park. A system of marshalling will be put in place by Grandpa Greene’s which will result in two members of staff managing deliveries vehicles entering and leaving the café and to warn people about the presence of a delivery vehicle”

When this has been raised with council officers, there has never been an attempt to address it. A further extract below has also never been adhered to –

“The Traffic Team is concerned that vehicles will park at the entrance to the park whilst waiting for takeaway coffee. Whilst this could happen there are enforceable double yellow lines across the park entrance which will deter illegal parking and as such a bollard is not considered to be needed on this occasion”. The number of tickets issued to deter this from happening is minimal – indeed this is a regular activity from the business staff themselves.

By increasing the hours of operation to sell alcohol, therefore becoming more of a night time economy premises there is an increased risk of taxi’s and or people being picked up and dropped off later into the evening. All for an ‘ice cream parlour’ on a children’s park.

Numerous residents have reported to both elected members and council officers with little impact.

There seems to be a regular pattern of continuous applications to vary the original business plans – hours of operation, extraction fan changes at point of build, alcohol sales and exterior seating and decking – all of which attracts little or no consultation with local residents – residents who are constantly asked to ‘see how it goes’.

Again, the business was touted as follows (extract from the businesses own neighbourhood responses report). There has been a continuous attempt to move away from this with little or no regard to how it may impact the locality.

“The café will be open to members of the public between 9am until 7pm each day of the week. Staff will arrive and start preparing food from 8am. Most days the café will close about 5pm, but during the summer days the opening hours will be extended to 7pm. In a district centre location the proposed hours are comparable to other

similar uses. A suitably worded planning condition that restricts hours of use would meet the planning tests”

It feels as though it is only a matter of time until further applications are submitted to extend the hours to 11/12pm.

Protection of Children from Harm

The premises is located, with a direct view into such, in a public park and a children’s play area. Why do we need to have an increased number of hours for children to observe alcohol consumption by adults. No other premises can be sighted from the park where adults can be seen consuming alcohol other than this ‘ice cream parlour’. This includes the play area, the grassed area where significant numbers of children play sports, especially in the summer months when the nights are lighter and the much loved stepping stones over the River Tame. If adults chose to take their children to a location where alcohol consumption can be seen by children that is their choice – this removes that choice.

Numerous people purchased homes in and around this site – I strongly suspect that if they were given the choice now overlooking a licensed premises they would not do so – myself included. Alcohol sales were never mentioned at the point of planning, so were not considered as part of any detrimental harm and if it would be outweighed, the venue already has a license and the application does not clearly state why the additional hours are required or needed – it can only therefore be assumed that there is simply no need to increase the licenses hours over and above a commercial gain - using the leverage of supplying a single toilet (which again will have to be open for any additional hours)

This is the second application recently that contradicts the original plans that residents were given no prior notification of.

Our property (a flat) overlooks the park and Greenes' prevents us from opening our balcony and windows due to the noise/behaviour and smells. We are further impacted by Greenes' not sticking to deliveries after 8am causing noise/fumes/inaccessibility to properties. This is an example of Greenes' not sticking to conditions imposed. Another is the toilet. Since I suffer from Ulcerative Colitis, I often need the toilet as I can't make it home. I have lost count of the number of times my Universal Disability Key wait walk at Greenes. A further example is the extractor fan where he installed an exterior one instead of an internal one as specified in the planning permission. Delivery vehicles are being allowed to block the road with engines left running. Several residents on Wade Row have had private signs made to try to stop users of Greenes and taxis from blocking their access and loitering whilst waiting to pick up customers and staff. This will be exacerbated by extending opening hours. *(3 photos attached)*



The High Street is a prime example of crime & disorder where drink is involved. Windows smashed, fighting, rude behaviour, sexual exploitation. The establishment is in a playing field & park. Used by children & family. It should be protected by a (Public Space Protection Order) to prohibit the consumption of alcohol in public spaces. The retractable roof & windows may allow this.

As written above we are putting visitors, tourists & neighbours more at risk during the evenings. Extremely close proximity to the park.

Noise is a major factor to the neighbours who are only 11 meters away. With this new variation application they are asking for an extra half-an-hour to allow customers to finish drinking which means that the tidying up time will begin at 10pm. Neighbours are already disturbed by noise & to think that it might be out of the T will be unbearable. Being so close & having my bedroom window open, going to bed between 9.30-10pm it will be impossible to sleep which will affect our health. I have a recording of one of the nights they opened under a temporary license. Loud noise from the oversized extractor fan, doors opening & closing, customers & staff smoking outside, cars pulling up on yellow lines below my bedroom window with engines running, picking up customers & staff. Customers & staff leaving.

Protection of Children from Harm.

We have to protect children from excessive bad adult behaviour after consuming alcohol. Families bring children to the field & park to play games, picnic, kick a ball & have fun. This is a lovely green area where they should feel safe & not be exposed to bad language & sexual innuendoes. The river runs through the bottom of the field.

Greene's was only meant and should be a daytime venue due to where it is situated.

Conclusion.

We feel that the restrictions made at the planning stage was not as Mr R. Scholes saw the future being of the business. He was declined the large decking area at the front of the building, declined later opening hours. Mr Scholes has not conformed with the toilet being able to be used by key holders. It is locked each time they leave & is a storage for the many signs he has. (Letter enclosed by a neighbour, Deborah Oduha, who I believe has complained. The extractor fan was supposed to be internal but is external through a variation application & the roof was higher than the original planning. He has applied for a pavement which was thankfully rejected. At planning they agreed to have deliveries no sooner than 8am & used the gates to let the vehicles in to deliver. They can arrive anytime after 8am (disturbing neighbours again because more often than not the vehicles park in front of the nearest neighbour & leave

Their engines running.

In the first few days of opening I had a conversation with him regarding the noise of the extractor fan and he said he would try to have something done about it. 2 years on it is no better. I also spoke to him regarding the kitchen door being left open (extra noise). He suggested a slow closure fitting but nothing has been done. I have 3 doors makes away opening & closing all day long.

Neighbours & Residents are concerned that if he is granted it may become a wine bar type venue in the evenings. One of the reasons the alcohol licence to be given was that he served afternoon teas & customers would like a glass of prosecco/wine with their afternoon tea. It appears from the recent evenings that alcohol is a major factor.

- 8.3 If relevant representations are received, the Authority may impose conditions to prevent nuisance, noise, disturbance, light pollution, noxious smells, vermin and pest infestations and accumulations of rubbish and litter.

5.3 In relation to ‘Prevention of Crime & Disorder’ the following paragraph(s) provide:-

- 6.8 The Authority accepts that only a small minority of customers are likely to behave badly, and this policy should be viewed as part of a framework of measures that will be used to tackle anti-social behavioural problems in any area where licensed premises are situated.
- 6.10 The presence of CCTV cameras can be an important means of deterring and detecting crime at, and immediately outside licensed premises. Conditions will not just consider a requirement to have CCTV on the premises, but also the precise siting of each camera, the requirement to maintain cameras in working order, and to retain recordings for an appropriate period of time. The police can provide individuals conducting risk assessments when preparing Operating Schedules with advice on the use of CCTV to prevent crime.

5.4 A full copy of the Councils Licensing Policy Statement will be available at the hearing.



6. Secretary of State's Guidance

6.1 Members also need to consider statutory guidance issued, by the Secretary of State, under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 (February 2025).

6.2 Chapter 2 of the guidelines deals with the Licensing Objectives and potential measures licence holders and the licensing authority should consider so they are not being undermined.

In relation to 'Crime & Disorder' the following paragraph(s) provide:

- 2.1 Licensing authorities should look to the police as the main source of advice on crime and disorder. They should also seek to involve the local Community Safety Partnership (CSP).
- 2.3 Conditions should be targeted on deterrence and preventing crime & disorder...for example, where there is good reason to suppose that disorder may take place, the presence of close-circuit (CCTV) cameras both inside and immediately outside the premises can actively deter disorder, nuisance, anti-social behaviour and crime generally. Some licence holders may wish to have cameras on their premises for the prevention of crime directed against the business itself, its staff, or its customers. But any condition may require a broader approach, and it may be appropriate to ensure that the precise location of cameras is set out on plans to ensure that certain areas are properly covered and there is no subsequent dispute over the terms of the condition.

In relation to 'Public Nuisance', the following paragraphs provide:-

- 2.21 The 2003 Act enables licensing authorities and responsible authorities, through representations, to consider what constitutes public nuisance and what is appropriate to prevent it in terms of conditions attached to specific premises licences and club premises certificates. It is therefore important that in considering the promotion of this licensing objective, licensing authorities and responsible authorities focus on the effect of the licensable activities at the specific premises on persons living and working (including those carrying on business) in the area around the premises which may be disproportionate and unreasonable. The issues will mainly concern noise nuisance, light pollution, noxious smells and litter.
- 2.22 Public nuisance is given a statutory meaning in many pieces of legislation. It is however not narrowly defined in the 2003 Act and retains its broad common law meaning. It may include in appropriate circumstances the reduction of the living and working amenity and environment of other persons living and working in the area of the licensed premises. Public nuisance may also arise as a result of the adverse effects of artificial light, dust, odour and insects or where its effect is prejudicial to health.

In relation to 'Protecting of children from harm', the following paragraphs provide:-

- 2.28 The protection of children from harm includes the protection of children from moral, psychological, and physical harm. This includes not only protecting children from the harms associated directly with alcohol consumption but also wider harms such as exposure to strong language and sexual expletives (for example in the context of exposure to certain films or adult entertainment). Licensing authorities must also consider the need to protect children from sexual exploitation when undertaking licensing functions.

2.35 Licensing authorities should give considerable weight to representations about child protection matters. In addition to the responsible authority whose functions relate directly to child protection, the Director of Public Health may also have access to relevant evidence to inform such representations. These representations may include, amongst other things, the use of health data about the harms that alcohol can cause to underage drinkers. Where a responsible authority, or other person, presents evidence to the licensing authority linking specific premises with harms to children (such as ambulance data or emergency department attendances by persons under 18 years old with alcohol-related illnesses or injuries) this evidence should be considered, and the licensing authority should also consider what action is appropriate to ensure this licensing objective is effectively enforced. In relation to applications for the grant of a licence in areas where evidence is presented on high levels of alcohol-related harms in persons aged under 18, it is recommended that the licensing authority considers what conditions may be appropriate to ensure that this objective is promoted effectively

6.3 A full copy of the guidance will be available at the hearing.

7. Options

7.1 When determining the application Members, having had regard to the representations, may take such steps as they consider appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. The steps available to Members are:

- a. Grant the application as applied for with or without the amendments agreed with Greater Manchester Police
- b. Grant the application but modify the operating schedule in relation to hours, days, conditions, or activities
- c. Reject the application

7.2 Any steps appropriate to promote the licensing objectives should be specified. If none of the steps are appropriate and proportionate, no action should be taken.

7.3 In arriving at a decision Members must have regard to the relevant provisions of national guidance and the licensing policy statement and reasons must be given for any departure.

7.4 The decision should be based on the individual merits of the application.

8. Consultation

8.1 Consultation in accordance with the Act has taken place with all responsible bodies and notice has been given to allow for any representations from interested parties.

9. Legal Services Comments

9.1 In determining the application Members should have regard to the Authority's licensing policy statement and the Secretary of State's Guidance. The applicant or any other person who made relevant representations in relation to the application have a right of appeal to the Magistrates' court. (A Evans)

10. Environmental and Health & Safety Implications

1. CCTV system installed and operational. System maintained in good working order to the satisfaction of Greater Manchester Police.
2. CCTV covers all areas of the store including the entrance, point of sale and main alcohol displays
3. CCTV must record whenever the premises is open for licensable activities
4. CCTV signage prominently displayed at the premises
5. CCTV must be capable of obtaining clear facial recognition image and a clear head and shoulders image of every person entering the premises and at the point of sale
6. Location of CCTV cameras recorded on the plan attached to the licence. Any additional cameras requested by the police will be fitted within a reasonable time.
7. The recording medium i.e., discs, tapes, hard drive etc, and associated images must be retained and securely stored for a minimum period of 31 days. These images must be made available to police and other authorised officers upon request
8. The premises licence holder or designated premises supervisor must provide police with contact details of at least one member of staff who are trained and familiar with the operation of the CCTV equipment so that they are able to provide copies of the recorded data upon request.
9. A full internal weekly check of the CCTV system will be made, and details recorded on a log sheet to ensure that the CCTV system is in good working order and that the recordings are time and date stamped
10. The premises licence holder or designate premises supervisor must ensure steps are taken to rectify any fault in the CCTV system immediately and a log of those steps are made available for inspection to police or other authorised officer

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

2. Incident Register

11. When the DPS is not on duty, there must be another authorised person who will be contactable at all times and be able to attend the premises within one hour while the supply and sale of alcohol is being undertaken, except in cases of emergency. The identity of this person will be known to all other staff engaged in the supply or sale of alcohol

12. No credit given for the sale of alcohol

13. Incident book maintained at the premises to record details of the following:
Any violence or anti-social behaviour on or immediately outside the premises
Any other crime or criminal activity on the premises
Any call for police/ambulance assistance to the premises

14. The incident log must be made available immediately on request to the police or other authorised officers. All records must be retained on the premises for 12 months from the date of the incident

15. Any staff employed at the premises must be provided with training before they sell alcohol and refresher training every 6 months thereafter. Training must include information on preventing the sale of alcohol to somebody who is drunk and age restricted products

16. Written record of all training carried out must be kept. These records must be stored on the premises and made available for inspection to police or another authorised officer upon request

c) Public safety

24.2. The premises licence holder, designated premises supervisor or nominated representative must regularly monitor the entries in the log, sign and date when checked. The book must be made available to police or another authorised officer upon request

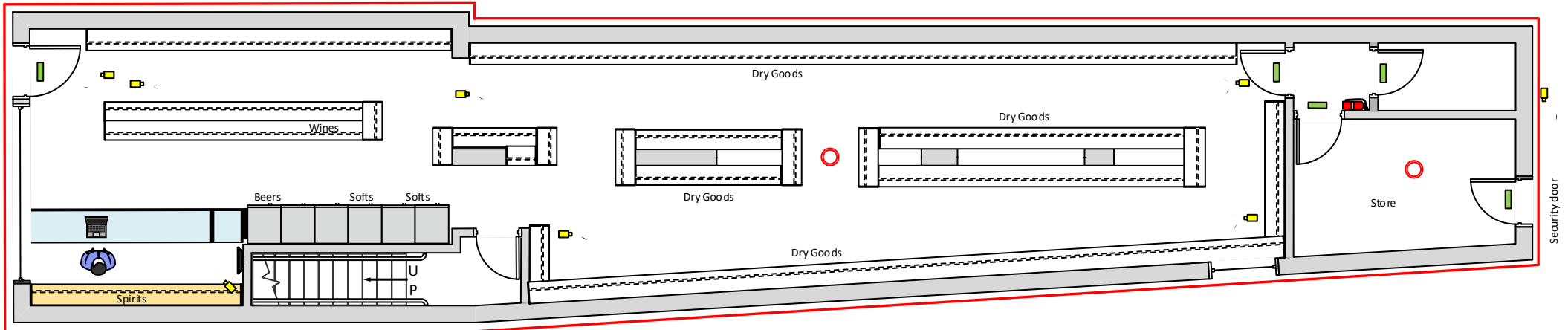

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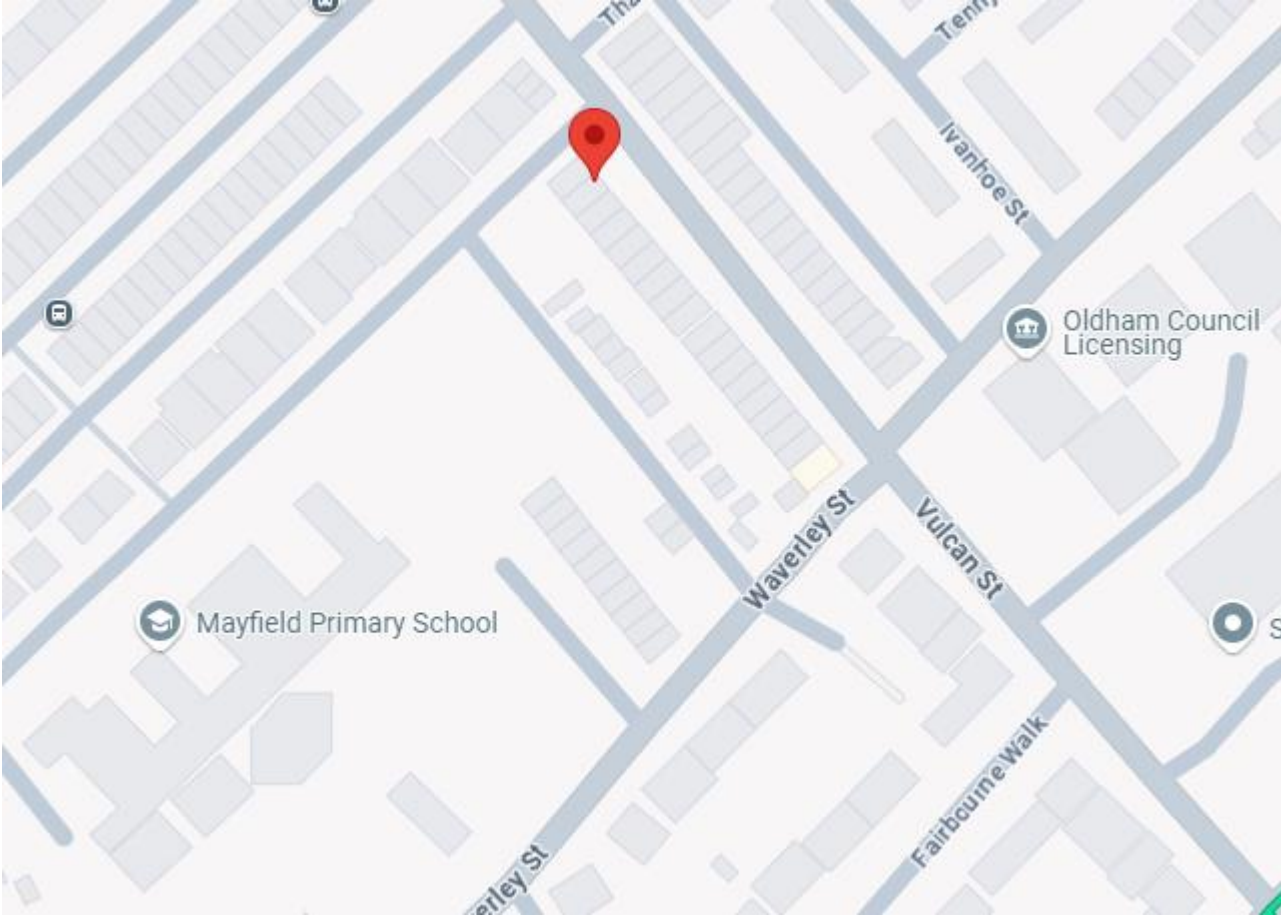

The shop would attract footfall and people gathering in an area of family housing 11pm and midnight this is not acceptable.

I wish to object to the application from **WARRAICH LIMITED** for a Premises Licence for **Go Local Express** and the sale and supply of alcohol from 07:00 and 00:00.

My objection is based on my concern that this new licence may increase the possibility of public nuisance for the many dwellings nearby, including my own. Given that there is already an off licence located less than 100 yards on the opposite end of the street, I also bring into question the need for such a premises. In addition to the fact that there is another shop located on London Road, also selling tobacco and alcohol. The opening of another shop selling the same items brings no value to the area nor does there appear to be any requirement for another shop.

Parking on the residential street is already at maximum capacity with residents having to park on neighbouring streets due to the yellow line present on Vulcan Street, this can be intimidating for residents in the evenings with the anti-social behaviour already present in the area. This is one factor that will definitely bring further disruption to the homeowners nearby not just by the footfall of potential customers, but by any staff working at the store.

There is also a concern regarding the opening hours, with Derker currently undergoing intense scrutiny over the crime rate linked to drugs and violence (Operation Vulcan), putting it in the same light as areas such as Strangeways and Piccadilly Gardens, creating a new late night hot spot supplying alcohol and tobacco, amongst other items, will draw unwanted attention as seen in other areas of the community when late night opening is available (See anti-social activity in areas such as Sholver, Greenacres etc).

The opening hours are also of particular concern, the houses on Vulcan street are old and when shutters are rolled, doors banged it is often felt through the adjoining homes. With the local shop already on Vulcan Street this is not a major issue as the store closes at 9pm which is seen as a reasonable time and is tolerated by the residents. Having the resounding sound of shutters trembling through your house at 07:00 and 23:00, I can presume would be pretty unbearable and likely to have a detrimental impact on anyone living in the properties affected and likely the value of the property.

Whilst we welcome a new business in the property, as the bakery was a much-loved addition to the street, yet another off licence isn't what the area needs. With 2 shops already on the area and Tesco, Asda and other shops close by, it will simply create another avenue for people to obtain alcohol in the late hours which studies have shown in deprived areas, does link further to criminal activity.

Researchers at Edinburgh University have looked in detail at the way alcohol is sold in different areas. They found that there is often a far higher concentration of shops selling alcohol in the poorest neighbourhoods. Wider research has tended to find that higher levels of 'outlet density' is linked to both higher levels of consumption and health harms. The implication of these findings, then, is that the 'harm paradox' is partly linked to a greater saturation of outlets – especially smaller shops selling very cheap alcohol – which, in turn facilitates higher levels of consumption.

I feel that another off licence on the street would also de value the houses on the street given the impact the shop would have on the street.

I would be grateful if the Licensing team would consider my objection.
