- A presentation was given to the Oldham Leadership Board on 26 September 2019 on the 'climate emergency'
- A presentation will be given to OLB introducing the forthcoming Oldham Green New Deal Strategy on 21 November 2019, and there will be a discussion around a potential Memorandum of Understanding between the Council and its partners on tackling climate change
- A report will be going to the Overview and Scrutiny Committee introducing the Oldham Green New Deal Strategy on 26 November 2019

## Note 2: Council - Improving Public Safety in Oldham's Night-Time Economy

The O&S Board were provided an update on work being undertaken across Greater Manchester related to improving public safety in the night time economy linked to the private hire and taxi trade and the suggestions made within the motion in particular the promotion of the 'Ask Angela' and Street Angel schemes through Oldham College, Oldham Sixth Form and the University. The Partnership Project Officer was continuing to work closely with the colleges and University and would be scheduling engagement sessions related to personal safety and darker nights. The Community Safety and Cohesion Partnership had recently received authorisation to utilise some of the Community Safety Grant for communications purposes and would be used towards the production of localised materials promoting both schemes.

Note 3: Council Motion - Calling on the Government to Fund Free TV Licences for All Over 75s

Further information was received on 10 September: The Council's front-line Welfare Rights Services were set up to provide consistent continuing advice to residents, especially residents who haven't claimed benefits the Council believed they may be entitled too. The services worked collaboratively with Age UK who have led a Pension Credit take up campaign and have been offering benefit checks to help people access pension credit where applicable. Age UK have provided benefit checks to 388 people since 1<sup>st</sup> April 2019 of which 258 people have been assisted with Pension Credit and in Quarter 1 the Welfare Rights Service had supported pensions to claim £3682.11 in pension credit. Further to this, the Council were looking to establish an internal poverty steering group which would include actions to support pensioners to claim benefits to which they were entitled.
