Purpose of Report

The purpose of this report is to consider the introduction of a safety zone outside the Chadderton Health and Wellbeing Centre on Burnley Street, Chadderton. The zone is being introduced as a result of a pedestrian accident that occurred in February 2016 when a child was involved in a collision on the existing zebra crossing facility.

Recommendation

It is recommended that a safety scheme, consisting of the provision road hump at the zebra crossing facility, together with improved hazard warning signs and road markings be approved. It is also recommended that a road hump notice be advertised in accordance with the schedule at the end of this report.

1 Background

- 1.1 Chadderton Health and Wellbeing Centre opened in November 2009 and is located at the junction of Burnley Street and Andrew Street. As part of the development a zebra crossing was introduced on Burnley Street, outside the front entrance to the Wellbeing Centre, to improve pedestrian safety for its users.
- 1.2 In February 2016 a serious road traffic collision occurred on the crossing facility which involved a 4 year old child. The Police investigated the incident and recommended certain measures be considered, but also requested that consideration be given to the introduction of a safety zone along the Burnley Street frontage of the Wellbeing Centre.
- 1.3 Funding has now been made available from the Capital Programme for measures to be introduced which will include the construction of a road hump feature at the zebra crossing together with advanced warning signing for both the road hump and crossing facility; the sign locations will also be used to create a gateway feature on each approach to the centre. Warning signs will be placed on the side road junctions in the vicinity of the wellbeing centre to alert motorists to the presence of a road hump; it is hoped all the measures described will reduce vehicle speeds on approach to the zebra crossing facility.
