Note 1: Chatty Checkouts and Café's – An update is as follows: A fast grant had been allocated to Chatty Café which would support many Chatty Café location packs; a meeting had taken place to draw together Chatty Café, Thriving Communities Team and Libraries. Post-Covid there was a plan to have chatter and natter tables in libraries and Chatty Mondays and Wednesdays, but social distancing had made this impossible currently and would be revisited in the spring. There was an offer to link with the existing volunteering offer in Oldham to grow the digital offer that Chatty Café had developed – a meeting can be supported by Action Together. Information has been shared with the five

social action fund projects to see how they can be linked into a future community of practice. There was also the potential for developing a digital offer with libraries to support people digitally e.g. zoom chats.
