Reason for Decision

The purpose of the report is to seek approval to proceed with the construction of the new depot and energy sources in Alexandra Park Eco Centre, as an early phase of the wider Eco Centre masterplan.

Executive Summary

On 25th January 2021, Cabinet approved Phase 1 of the Alexandra Park Eco Centre, comprising a new office building that is heated by an air source heat pump/mains electricity power system, with a new substation, and new CCTV and external lighting over the car park and landscaping areas.

On 18th May 2021, the main contract for the project was put out to tender, with three contractors submitting prices for the construction element of the project. A robust assessment and evaluation process, and a preferred contractor identified – refer to the details in part b paper.

Recommendations

Cabinet are asked to approve the construction of the new depot and energy sources in Alexandra Park Eco Centre, as an early phase of the wider Eco Centre masterplan.

Alexandra Park Eco Centre (Phase 1): Appointment of the main contractor and construction commencement

1 Background

- 1.1 Alexandra Park Depot is a base for 222 staff that deliver the following services:
 - Maintenance of the borough's parks and gardens
 - Plant growing to service planters and hanging baskets
 - Greenspace and countryside management
 - Tree maintenance
 - Playground maintenance
 - Street cleansing
 - Weed spraying
 - Running and maintenance of the borough's cemeteries
 - School grounds maintenance (via SLAs)
 - Delivery of environmental projects with s106 and LIFT monies
- 1.2 Currently, staff are spread over several buildings and structures throughout the depot, with the main office being the former Gardener's Lodge. A number of these structures (including the Gardener's Lodge) were identified in a 2016 condition survey as requiring varying degrees of maintenance. In recent years, the Gardener's Lodge has come into a serious state of disrepair, raising significant health and safety concerns for staff and visitors, and has had to be propped at its gable end due to ground movement in the vicinity.
- 1.3 On 25th January 2021, Cabinet approved the construction of a new office building to be heated by a carbon reducing air source heat pump system and mains electricity. The appointed design team have developed the plans which were subsequently put out to tender in May 2021, with returns in early July. Following a robust tender evaluation process, a preferred contractor has been identified. It is proposed that the appointment is confirmed, funding drawn down to allow a start on site in November 2021.
