Subject: Trent Road and Cheviots Road, Shaw - Proposed

Prohibition of Waiting

Reason for the decision:

Transport for Greater Manchester have asked that improvements be made to an existing bus stop arrangement at Trent Road, Shaw, to enable bus passengers to board and alight the bus from a full height kerb. To achieve this, it will be necessary to move the bus stop area further into the carriageway and introduce a footway build out area for the bus to pull up to. The bus stop is also a timing point, which means buses can be stationary at the stop for periods of up to 5 minutes.

On the opposite side of the carriageway, vehicles are regularly parked on the street, which makes access difficult for moving traffic along Trent Road, when there is a stationary bus stopped for a longer period of time. It is therefore felt that the ability to park on the opposite side of the road to the bus stop should be removed by the introduction of double yellow lines.

The purpose of the report of the report is to seek **Summary:**

> approval for the introduction of prohibitive waiting (double yellow lines) along part of Trent

Road, Shaw.

Option 1 – introduce the double yellow lines to remove problematic parking

What are the legal implications?

The Council must be satisfied that it is expedient to make the Traffic Regulation Order in order to avoid danger to persons or other traffic using the road or any other road or for preventing the likelihood of any such danger arising, or for preventing damage to the road or to any building on or near the road, or for facilitating the passage on the road or any other road of any class of traffic, including pedestrians, or for preventing the use of the road by vehicular traffic of a kind which, or its use by vehicular traffic in a manner which, is unsuitable having regard to the existing

character of the road or adjoining property or for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which the road runs.

In addition to the above, under section 122 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, it shall be the duty of the Council so to exercise the functions conferred on them by the Act as to secure the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of vehicular and other traffic (including pedestrians) and the provision of suitable and adequate parking facilities on and off the highway. Regard must also be had to the desirability of securing and maintaining reasonable access to premises, the effect on the amenities of any locality affected and the importance of regulating and restricting the use of roads by heavy commercial vehicles so as to preserve or improve the amenities of the areas through which the roads run, the strategy produced under section 80 Environmental Protection Act 1990 (the national air quality strategy), the importance of facilitating the passage of public service vehicles and of securing the safety and convenience of persons using or desiring to use such vehicles and any other matters appearing to the Council to be relevant.
