Local Improvement Fund (LIF) Application Success

- Wildbrook Food Hub successfully allocated £32000 to renovate the vandalised building converting it into a community food hub where residents can take advantage of cooking classes.
- Safe Green Space for Medlock Vale successfully allocated £15000 to for fencing around the green field, creating an enclosed space for children to play and adults to socialise.
- **Coppice Community Garden** successfully allocated £3500 to create a communal space that will not only beautify the neighbourhood but also serve as a hub for social interaction and cultural enrichment.
- **Alley Gates** successful allocation of £3500 for alley gates in a location that is a frequent hot spot for flytipping and anti-social behavior.

Working with community groups

- **Wildbrook Food Hub** working closely to support the on-going renovation of the growing hub and providing suggestions for future improvements and funding.
- Salvation Army supported the uniform hub initiative and also nominated for "make a wish" mayors fund.
- Coppice Community Hub involved the creation of monthly and fortnightly women's and men's coffee mornings, creating an environment for socialising and learning. These events have been a great opportunity for councilors to engage with residents, discussing topics and issues.
- Fitton Hill Bulldogs Sports and Community hub went to view the site and an introduction to the team who have done a fantastic job in developing building. Discussed opportunities for future improvements, looking forward to working closely with the team.

Creating cleaner and safer neighborhoods

- Improved roads and paths used by young children on a daily basis on their way to school.
- Engaged with the highways team to ensure gulley's in Medlock Vale are cleaned, many are blocked causing large puddles and unwanted smells.
- Raised the state of alleyways in the Medlock Vale area on many occasions to the Environments teams, now working on a solution to clean these up, creating a useable access point for residents.
- Fly tipping overall has reduced as cases have been reported and residents have been prosecuted.
