Work in the community

The tool library we created continues to grow and the work the tools enable also continues to grow across the ward with more projects in the pipeline. After being contacted by local residents we organized and took part in a huge clean up operation close to the Glodwick Lows and with the help of our fantastic council colleagues replaced the worn-out steps making it safer for walkers, dog walkers and passers by to walk across. A huge thank you to the local residents that did so much and led on this work.





Holts

Working with partners including the Fire Service, Police, First Choice Homes and the community we held a day of action where we engaged residents about issues on Holts Village.

We continue to take a partnership across Holts working with residents across the village including supporting community groups, individual residents with any ideas they might want to progress and general case work.

Local Improvement Fund (LIF) bids

Like last year we have again been successful with LIF bids including a successful bid of £35,155 for the Eldon Street play area which will be used for much needed renovation and improvements. Families in the surrounding areas will be able to enjoy a newly refurbished play area thanks to the successful application.

We were also successful in attracting funding for Glodwick Cricket Club to begin to develop a girls' team and funding for the Alexandra west Community Group.
