Work in the community

I have reached out to the residents of Medlock Vale Ward through holding surgeries at different locations, The Hathershaw Centre, Bardsley Methodist Church, Fitton Hill Library and CCH. I have attended regular meetings and worked alongside many local groups such as For Housing and FCHO, the local Community safety team and district officer to maintain good working relations within the community. I have also attended community and charity events, participated in community groups such as The Brew, Coppice Community Hub, Women and BAME groups. Other activities have included door knocking, communication through social media platforms, leafletting and holding regular resident's meetings.

To complement the work in Medlock Vale ward I have made successful LIF bids to create a Tool Library, Benches and ground markings for children to play in a safe area. The tool library will enable us to work with community groups to carry out projects as identified by our residents. The benches and play area is significant in keeping our young children safe and for our ageing community, a sense of space, to get active, communicate with locals and explore the outdoor space whilst knowing they have a place to rest, it enables us to utilise and cherish the little green space we have.

I am involved with many initiatives that benefit residents such as St Martins Park development, Family Hub interventions, BAME/Young women community groups, regular contact with local development strategies. Highway, Environmental, health and well-being and educational facilities in improving local lives.

I have supported many residents locally and borough wide with many issues (too many to list) and have never been complacent about taking on casework. I have visited the most vulnerable and fragile residents in the comfort of their home and have always had an open-door policy be at my local office (work) or at home.
