Background

On 30 July 2024 MHCLG published details of their proposed reforms to the National Planning Policy Framework and other changes to the planning system

The consultation runs up to 24 September 2024.

Summary of key NPPF revisions and proposed consultation response

There are a total of 106 questions that may be responded to. These are sub-divided into the following chapters:

- Chapter 3 Planning for the homes we need
- Chapter 4 A new Standard Method for assessing housing needs
- Chapter 5 Brownfield, grey belt and the Green Belt
- Chapter 6 Delivering affordable, well-designed homes and places
- Chapter 7 Building infrastructure to grow the economy
- Chapter 8 Delivering community needs
- Chapter 9 Supporting green energy and the environment
- Chapter 10 Changes to local plan intervention criteria
- Chapter 11 Changes to planning application fees and cost recovery for local authorities related to Nationally Significant Infrastructure Projects
- Chapter 12 The future of planning policy and plan making
- Chapter 13 Public Sector Equality Duty
