Reason for decision

This report seeks delegated approval for the revocation of a section of 'No Waiting At Any Time' restriction on Penmore Close, Shaw, in line with the schedule and drawing at the end of this report.

Recommendation

It is recommended that the revocation is supported and progressed in accordance with legal procedures, in accordance with the drawings and schedules at the end of this report.

Background

Officers have received complaints from residents of Penmore Close and Cunliffe Drive regarding inconsiderate parking by motorists who do reside in the area. Officers have visited the area and whilst all motorists are entitled to park within the highway, the existing restrictions on Penmore Close could be contributing to the issues raised by residents.

Reducing the extent of the parking restrictions will provide additional parking spaces to alleviate the need to park in front of resident's properties and provide some mitigation to address the concerns raised.

Alternative option to be considered

Option 1 – Accept the proposal.

Option 2 - Do not accept the proposal and accept that on street parking is not permitted along the extents of the existing restrictions.

Consultation

If this proposal is supported, the changes to the parking restrictions will be advertised on site and residents within the area provided with a plan of the proposed changes.

The Ward Members have been consulted and Councillor H Sykes supports this proposal stating that the proposed changes will make things easier for local residents
