a) General – all four licensing objectives (b, c, d and e) (please read guidance note 11)

- No glassware or alcohol will be permitted outside of the premises.
- A Notice will be displayed at the entrance to the premises confirming that no alcoholic drinks are to be taken outside of the premises.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

- The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system. All key areas of the licensed premises, including all public entry and exit points will be covered. The CCTV cameras shall continually record while the premises are open to the public and recordings shall be kept available and unedited for a minimum of 30 days with date and time stamping.
- The system will be maintained by a suitably qualified engineer and records of this maintenance will be retained.
- An incident log (which may electronically recorded) shall be kept at the
 premises for at least six months, and made available on request to the
 Police or an Authorised Officer of the Licensing Authority, which will record
 the following incidents including pertinent details:
 - -all alleged crimes reported to the venue or by the venue to the police
 - all ejections of patrons
 - any incidents of disorder
 - -any faults in the CCTV system
 - any refusal of the sale of alcohol
- All staff shall be trained in recognising signs of drunkenness, how to refuse service, the premises' duty of care, maintaining a refusals log, prevention of underage sales and the conditions in force under the Premises Licence.
- Documented records of training shall be kept for each member of staff.
- A log (which may be electronically recorded) shall be kept detailing refused sales.

c) Public safety

- All firefighting equipment is inspected and serviced in line with the appropriate British Standard.
- An adequate and appropriate supply of first aid equipment and materials will be available on the premises, and records will be maintained in relation to the supply of any first aid treatment.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

- No noise shall emanate from the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
- Notices shall be prominently displayed requesting that patrons respect the needs of local residents when leaving the area.
- Regular checks will be made to ensure that no noise or lighting constitutes a nuisance to the nearest sensitive properties.
- The premises will adopt the Dispersal Policy as attached.
- A designated smoking area will be adopted after 17:00 daily to the ice cream serving hatch side of the premises to ensure that smokers are not congregating close to residents.
- Clear and legible notices must be prominently displayed in any area used for smoking requesting customers to respect the needs of local residents and use the area quietly.
- There shall be no noise or odours caused by the kitchen extraction equipment that gives rise to a nuisance.
- No bottle / rubbish bins will be emptied between 21:00 and 08:00.
- All waste shall be properly presented and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection times.

e) The protection of children from harm

- The Challenge 25 Scheme will be operated to ensure that any person who appears to be under the age of 25 shall provide documented proof that he/she is over 18 years of age. Proof of age shall only comprise a passport, photo card driving licence, an EU/EEA national ID card or similar document, an HM Forces warrant card or a card bearing the PASS hologram.
- The premises shall display prominent signage indicating that the Challenge 25 Scheme is in operation.
- A Refusals Record must be kept at the premises which details all refusals to sell alcohol. This record must include the date and time of the incident, a description of the customer, the name of the staff member who refused the sale and the reason the sale was refused. All entries must be made within 24 hours of the refusal. The record must be available for inspection by an officer of a Responsible Authority.
- In addition to any other training, the premises licence holder shall ensure that all staff are trained to prevent underage sales, are aware of and prevent proxy sales, maintain the refusals and incident logs and monitor staff to ensure their training is put into practice.

 - Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
 - Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
 - Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
 - Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol,

- provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
- o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
