Reason for decision

Allocate resources secured through a Section 106 planning obligation, DB411 Land at Wellyhole Street, Oldham to fund improvements of traffic calming measures on Wellyhole Street, Oldham set out in the report.

Recommendation(s)

It is recommended that:

The allocation of £25,000.00 (plus interest) Section 106 resources from DB411 are allocated to allow the traffic calming scheme at Wellyhole Street, Oldham (PA/332617) to be implemented.

Background

- 1.1 Planning permission for the development at Land at Wellyhole Street, Oldham (PA/332617) was granted subject to the developer first entering a Section 106 Unilateral Undertaking. The developer agreed to pay The Council a sum of £25,000.00 towards a traffic calming scheme on Wellyhole Street fronting the development.
- 1.2 The payment was made on the 4 October 2021, on occupation of the tenth dwelling as per the terms of the S106 agreement.
- 1.3 The development has since been completed and all dwellings are now occupied.
- 1.4 A larger traffic calming scheme was implemented on Wellhole Street/Constantine Street and this contribution will see the construction of the final traffic calming feature and complete the scheme.

Alternative option(s) to be considered

2.1 Option 1: To approve the recommendation and meet the requirements of the Planning Decision and use the funds paid by the developer under their S106 agreement for this purpose.

2.2 Option 2: Not to approve the recommendation and allow rat running traffic through the area. To not use the funds paid via the S106 could lead to the funds being returned to the developer.

Consultation

All statutory consultees have been previously consulted on the full scheme and there were no objections.

Risks

To not use the funds paid via the S106 could lead to the funds being returned to the developer and the traffic calming scheme incomplete which could lead to higher traffic speeds.

Implications

The cost estimate for the scheme is £25,455.00.

The costs of £25,455.00 would be 100% met by using the S106 contribution (including interest) from the developer under reference DB411

	The proposed works are capital and are estimated to cost £24,455. The works will be fully funded from Section 106 contributions, which have been received and are available for use.
Financial	The works will be fully defrayed in the 2025/26 financial year.
