## Reason for decision

To obtain approval for the adoption of highways as Highway Authority and to identify the likely associated revenue costs to the Council.

## Recommendation(s)

Option 1, To adopt, on behalf of the Council as Highway Authority, the highways specified in Schedule 1 at the end of this report as highways maintainable at public expense, effective immediately.

## Background

The highway at this development has been constructed by the developer to the Council's currently approved specifications for new highways. The Developer and the Council entered into a Section 38 Agreement (Highways Act 1980) whereby the local authority agreed to adopt the new road and take over the responsibility for maintaining it once it was satisfied that the highway had been built to its specified standards and in accordance with the planning consents which were granted for the development.

This report is the conclusion of this process. The highway has been inspected throughout its construction and has been subject to a twelve-month maintenance period prior to its final inspection and approval for adoption.

## Consultation

The Ward Members have been consulted Councillor J Charters has no issue with this, happy with this to proceed.

## Risks

The adoption of the highway(s) at this location is under a completed Section 38 Agreement (Highways Act 1980) between the Council and the housing developer and as such even though the adoption will provide an ongoing financial liability to the Council for inspection and maintenance of the highway and street lighting equipment, there are financial/legal and reputation risks which could arise from legal action by the developer and residents if the adoption of the highways does not proceed. The change in status of the highway will be recorded in the Council's Local Street Gazetteer and in future the highway will be inspected and maintained by Oldham Highways in line with current Council schedules and specifications.

## Implications

Financial	<p>The maintenance cost for increasing the length of adopted road in Oldham by 232 linear metres (2,210 square metres) as detailed in Schedule 1 of this report is estimated to be £4,440 annually and will be revenue expenditure. (Based on a maintenance estimate of £2.00 per square metre of highway, extracted from the Spon's Civil Engineering and Highway Works Price Book). This will be funded from within the Highway Operations Service.</p> <p>The adoption of the Highway will also result in growth in the Council's commitment for the maintenance of Street Lighting equipment.</p> <p>Based on maintenance and electrical supply costs as detailed in schedule 2, this is expected to increase charges by an estimated £1458.36 annually.</p> <p>(John Edisbury)</p>
Legal	<p>As there is a signed section 38 agreement in place, the Council is contractually obliged to adopt the highways at the end of the maintenance period. (A Evans)</p>

Extension to Stevenson Drive	<p>From the existing adopted highway fronting nos. 110-114 Stevenson Drive and continuing in a generally northerly direction for a distance of 45 metres, then continuing for a distance of 35 metres in an easterly direction, then continuing northerly for a distance of 56 metres to join the existing adopted highway at Coleridge Road.</p> <p>From a point 25 metres south of its junction with Coleridge Road at the gable of no. 156 Stevenson Drive and continuing for a distance of 60 metres to its cul-de-sac end with associated turning heads of 18 and 8 metres, respectively.</p> <p>Additional footway fronting nos. 108 and 110 Coleridge Road for a distance of 10 metres.</p> <p>Total Area = 2,210m<sup>2</sup></p>
