#### Reason for decision

To appoint Met Geo to carry out Ground Penetrating Radar and Topographical surveys for the Oldham Low Carbon Heat Network project, at a cost of £240,845 excl. VAT.

## Recommendation(s)

1. That the Council appoint Met Geo to carry out the required surveys.

### **Background**

In February 2024, Cabinet accepted £8.8m of Green Heat Network Fund grant funding to support development and delivery of the Oldham Low Carbon Heat Network. £1m of this is Commercialisation (revenue) grant and the remaining £7.8m is Construction (capital) grant. The report to Cabinet delegated authority to appoint consultants and contractors to the Deputy Chief Executive and to Legal Services to sign and seal the associated contracts.

To achieve RIBA Stages 3 and 4 design for the heat network, and in particular the proposed Early Works in the Town Centre, the Council needs to commission a set of surveys including Ground Penetrating Radar and Topographical surveys of the area. The area which has been identified in particular for the proposed Early Works will be prioritised for these surveys.

The funder (Triple Point / DESNZ) has confirmed that the survey works can be charged to the £7.8m Construction (Capital) grant which has already been secured by the Council.

#### Alternative option(s) to be considered

1. <u>Appoint Met Geo (preferred option).</u> Under this option, Met Geo will carry out the survey work which is on the critical path for the Low Carbon Heat Network project and in particular the proposed Early Works, enabling other consultants to complete RIBA Stages 3 and 4 design for the procurement of a delivery contractor.

2. <u>Do not appoint Met Geo.</u> Under this option, the surveys will not be carried out and the Low Carbon Heat Network project will not progress.

V .	The tender for Consultancy Services for Survey-Topographical and GPR Survey was issued on 29 July 2025. Local tender was chosen as a sourcing route as it was envisaged that the cost will be less than £100k. Tender closed on 21 August 2025.		
Procurement	Six(6) bidders were invited out of which Four (4) responded. Two (2) bids were dismissed as they were non-compliant. These bidders submitted cost for the tender and partially answered associated tender documents (1 ITT question out of 5 and did not submit any Social Value response) leading to their bid dismissal.
